SETTING THE SCENE

The 134th season of Lehigh football officially begins today as the Mountain Hawks welcome Villanova to Goodman Stadium in a battle of nationally-ranked regional rivals. The Mountain Hawks won their 11th Patriot League football championship in 2016, posting a 9-3 record that included a nine-game winning streak and a second straight win over Lafayette on the way to Lehigh's first FCS playoff appearance since 2011. Eight starters return to an offense that ranked in the top 10 in the FCS last year, including 1,000-yard receivers Troy Pelletier and Gatlin Casey and 1,000-yard rusher Dom Bragalone. Junior Brad Mayes takes over as Lehigh's starting quarterback. Villanova went 9-4 last season and earned an at-large berth to the FCS playoffs, reaching the second round.

KEY STATS

- •Lehigh set school records with 466 points and 5,806 yards of total offense in 2016.
- The Mountain Hawks averaged 44.8 points in their nine wins in 2016 and scored exactly 21 points in all three of their losses.
- Lehigh was 9-0 in 2016 when Gatlin Casey scored at least one touchdown, and 0-3 when Casey failed to reach the end zone.
- Lehigh's roster features 19 freshmen, 20 sophomores, 30 juniors and 17 seniors (3 fifth-years).

LEHIGH HEAD COACH ANDY COEN

The 2016 Patriot League Coach of the Year, Andy Coen is in his 12th season as the head coach of the Lehigh football program. He holds a career record of 77-49 and now ranks second in school history in career victories. In 11 years as the Mountain Hawks leader, Coen has produced 122 All-Patriot League honorees, 23 All-Americans and 219 Patriot League Academic Honor Roll selections. Coen has led Lehigh to four Patriot League Championships in 11 seasons. Coen was also named Coach of the Year in 2010 and is a three-time finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award, finishing as high as sixth in 2011. (Coach Coen's complete bio can be found on page 14)

VILLANOVA HEAD COACH MARK FERRANTE

A longtime member of the Villanova coaching staff, Mark Ferrante makes his head coaching debut today. Ferrante served under Andy Talley for the last 30 seasons, coaching the offensive line for the last 27, and serving as assistant head coach for the last 18. He was an All-America quarterback for Talley at St. Lawrence, graduating in 1983.

THE SERIES

Lehigh and Villanova will meet for the 14th time, with the Wildcats holding an 8-5 edge in the series. Villanova has won the last five meetings. Lehigh's last win in the series, a 31-28 triumph at Villanova in 2006 was Andy Coen's first win as a head coach. This is the third time Lehigh is opening its season against Villanova (1919, 2007).

THE LAST TIME THEY MET

VILLANOVA, Pa. (9/10/16) - In a back-and-forth affair, No. 22/19 Villanova came-from-behind twice to take a lead and then held off Lehigh's late bid at a game-winning drive as the Wildcats handed the Mountain Hawks their second straight defeat, 26-21 at Villanova Stadium. The Mountain Hawks (0-2) used a strong second quarter to take a 14-6 lead into halftime but the Wildcats (1-1) outscored Lehigh 20-7 in over the second 30 minutes. Villanova out-gained Lehigh 452-364 on the evening, racking up 396 rushing yards, including 239 in the second half. Junior Troy Pelletier led Lehigh offensively with 13 receptions for 121 yards. Senior Nick Shafnisky completed 29-of-41 passes for 246 yards with one touchdown and one interception. His 11-yard strike to senior Derek Knott gave Lehigh a 21-20 lead with 8:03 to play, but Villanova answered with an eight-play, 83-yard drive culminating in a Javon White two-yard touchdown run on 4th-and-1 for the go-ahead score.

FOUR CAPTAINS NAMED

Near the end of preseason camp, coach Andy Coen named four captains for the 2017 season. Fifth-year seniors Zach Duffy (Reading, Pa.) and Brandon Short (Mentor, Ohio) will serve as captains for the second straight season and will be joined by fifth-year defensive lineman Jimmy Mitchell (La Grange Park, Ill.) Safety Sam McCloskey (Altoona, Pa.) is the first Lehigh junior to be named a captain since Sedale Threatt in 2006.

LID LIFTERS

Lehigh has an 83-44-6 all-time record in its season-opening contests. The Mountain Hawks are 6-5 in season openers under Andy Coen and have won five of their last seven openers. Lehigh is just 4-7 in home openers under Andy Coen. This is the third time Lehigh has opened its season against Villanova with the Brown and White winning in 1919 and the Wildcats winning in 2007. Villanova also spoiled Lehigh's home opener in 2010.

COEN CLIMBING THE LADDER

Last season Lehigh head coach Andy Coen picked up his 75th career victory in a win over Fordham and a week later against Bucknell moved past the legendary John Whitehead, head coach of the 1977 national champions, for second on Lehigh's career wins list. Bill Leckonby tops the list with 85 victories from 1946-1961.

WELCOME BACK

Lehigh returns eight of the 11 players named to last season's All-Patriot League teams. Senior wide receiver Troy Pelletier is a three-time all-league selection and a two-time first-team pick, while seniors Zach Duffy and Tim O'Hara and junior Dom Bragalone are two-time all-league selections. Senior Gatlin Casey and junior Ed Mish were all-league selections at two different positions in 2016 while seniors Brandon Short and Tyler Cavenas were also recognized following the 2016 campaign. All of Lehigh's returning all-league players, except for Short were named to the Preseason All-Patriot League team in late July.

RUSHING TO VICTORY

In 11 seasons under Andy Coen Lehigh has had trouble winning games when it rushes for fewer than 100 yards. The Mountain Hawks have failed to reach the century mark 38 times under Coen and are 14-24 in those games. When Lehigh has surpassed 100 yards during that time, it is 63-25. Lehigh eclipsed the 100 yard mark in eight of 12 games last year and has gained more than 150 yards on the ground in 27 of 45 games dating back to the start of the 2013 season. Over the last two seasons, Lehigh has had 10 games of more than 200 yards rushing, highlighted by a 349 yard showing versus Fordham last October.

FROM COAST TO COAST

The Lehigh coaching staff prides itself in bringing in student-athletes from across the nation. This season, 17 states (plus Canada) are represented on the Mountain Hawks roster, including California, Connecticut, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Montana, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Texas and Virginia. The state with the most representation is New Jersey, as 27 Mountain Hawks hail from the Garden State.

PENNSYLVANIA PROUD

The Mountain Hawks' roster features 20 student-athletes from the state of Pennsylvania including a pair who played high school football in the East Penn Conference (formerly Lehigh Valley Conference) or Colonial League. Lehigh's local contingent consists of junior tight end Jake Buskirk (Whitehall/Whitehall) and junior wide receiver Cam Richardson (Fogelsville/Northwestern Lehigh).

LAST TIME OUT

No. 18/15 LEHIGH AT No. 22/21 UNH

DURHAM, N.H. (11/26/16) - Lehigh fell into an early 22-0 hole, which proved too much to overcome as the Mountain Hawks pulled within 36-21, but couldn't get any closer in a 64-21 loss at New Hampshire in the first round of the FCS Playoffs Saturday in front of 2,240 at Wildcat Stadium.

Sophomore quarterback Brad Mayes was 24-of-43 for 273 yards with a touchdown and interception, in place of senior Nick Shafnisky who didn't start due to illness. The Mountain Hawks' defense did force three turnovers, but Lehigh turned the ball over four times itself after committing just eight turnovers over its first 11 games of the season. Lehigh's four giveaways led to 21 Wildcat points.

New Hampshire outgained Lehigh 637-399, highlighted by a commanding 364-85 advantage on the ground. Lehigh held a 314-273 edge through the air.

Shafnisky did enter into the game, finishing 5-of-13 with a pair of interceptions, while adding a rushing touchdown. Junior Troy Pelletier finished with eight catches for 138 yards while senior Derek Knott recorded eight receptions for 84 yards and classmate Trevor Socarras had seven catches for 44 yards. Sophomore Dominick Bragalone rushed 13 times for 65 yards, highlighted by a 37-yard touchdown scamper.

Senior Evan Harvey and sophomores Sam McCloskey and Kareem Montgomery each had interceptions for the defense.

McCloskey led Lehigh with eight tackles, while junior Tyler Cavenas added seven and a sack.

Adam Riese finished 18-of-30 for 273 yards, with three touchdowns and three interceptions for New Hampshire. Dalton Crossan and Trevon Bryant both eclipsed 100 yards rushing with Crossan gaining 184 on 24 carries and Bryant netting 113 on 11. They both scored two touchdowns.

MAYES TAKES THE REINS

With the graduation of 2016 Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year Nick Shafnisky, junior Brad Mayes takes over as Lehigh's starting quarterback. Mayes appeared in 13 games over his first two seasons, throwing for 2,124 yards and 20 touchdowns, against just six interceptions. The Tampa, Fla. native owns a 4-1 record as a starting quarterback, with the lone loss coming in last year's playoff game at New Hampshire. Mayes' first start in 2016 was memorable as he threw for a Lehigh and Yale Bowl-record 524 yards in a 63-35 Mountain Hawks win at Yale. He also matched a school record with six touchdown passes. In his first five career starts, Mayes has thrown 15 touchdown passes and just one interception.

AN ENCORE FOR THE OFFENSE

Much of Lehigh's success in 2016 can be attributed to a high-powered offense that ranked sixth in the FCS in both passing yards and total yards, and ninth nationally in scoring. The Mountain Hawks established school single-season records with 466 points scored and 5,806 yards of total offense. Lehigh scored 40 or more points in seven of its nine wins, led by a 63-point effort at Yale and a 58 point showing against Fordham. The Mountain Hawks lost just three offensive starters from last year's unit with the experienced Brad Mayes taking over at quarterback, junior Luke Christiano expected to start at slot receiver and freshman Jackson Evans slated to step in at left guard.

THE GUYS UP FRONT

Lehigh's offensive success over the last two seasons can be attributed to a cohesive, veteran offensive line. The Mountain Hawks' top five linemen have made 54 out of a possible 55 starts in 2015 and 59 out of 60 last season and paved the way for a Lehigh offense that averaged 158.9 rushing yards and 324.9 passing yards per game. Lehigh's projected starting line features three all-league performers in fifth-year seniors Zach Duffy (right tackle) and Brandon Short (center), and senior Tim O'Hara at left tackle. Junior Liborio Ricottilli returns as a starter at right guard, while the lone new starter will be Jackson Evans at left guard.

DRIVE FOR FIVE

Lehigh's roster features three student-athletes who earned fifth years of eligibility due to medical hardships: offensive linemen Zach Duffy and Brandon Short and defensive lineman Jimmy Mitchell. Both Duffy and Mitchell were sidelined in their true freshman seasons, while Short lost his sophomore season after three games. All three fifth-years will serve as team captains.

A FRESH START

Lehigh has added 19 first-year student-athletes to its 2017 roster, including several who could contribute right away. Five freshmen appear on Lehigh's depth chart (page 11), including Jackson Evans, who is projected to start at guard. Six of Lehigh's 20 sophomores appeared in at least nine games as freshman, led by Riley O'Neil, who started all 12 games at free safety.

STARTING BLOCK

Five Mountain Hawks are projected to make their first career starts today. Offensively, junior Luke Christiano could start at slot receiver and freshman Jackson Evans at guard. On defense, end Harrison Kauffman and linebackers Matt Butler and Keith Woetzel could start for the first time today. If Evans starts, he would become the first freshman to start a game on the offensive line for Lehigh since Will Rackley in 2007.

DOUBLE TROUBLE

Lehigh returns one of the top receiving duos in the FCS in seniors Troy Pelletier and Gatlin Casey. Last year both players earned first team All-Patriot League honors and ranked in the top 12 nationally in receiving. Pelletier and Casey combined for 158 catches, 2,413 yards and 26 touchdowns. With 1,278 and and 1,135 yards, respectively, Pelletier and Casey became just the second Lehigh duo to both go over 1,000 yards in a season. Lehigh's 2011 Patriot League Championship team featured Ryan Spadola (1,614) and Jake Drwal (1,060). Last season, Pelletier and Casey also both had 100-yard receiving games in consecutive wins over Princeton, Yale and Colgate, becoming the first duo to have 100 receiving yards in the same game since Lee Kurfis (117) and Sergio Fernandez-Soto (123) against New Hampshire in 2013.

THE MAN OF TROY

Troy Pelletier enters his senior season with a chance to become the most accomplished wide receiver in school history. Pelletier enters the 2017 campaign 15 receptions and and 738 yards away from the school record, held by Lehigh Hall of Famer Rennie Benn '86. Pelletier caught 96 passes for 1,278 yards and 12 touchdowns as a junior, earning All-Patriot League honors for the third consecutive season and earning a pair of third-team All-America honors. The New Hampshire native had seven 100-yard receiving games in 2016 and was a finalist for the Walter Payton Award. Pelletier has been recognized as a Preseason All-American by STATS FCS and was named to the watch list for the 2017 Walter Payton Award.

DON'T SLEEP ON THE OTHER GUY

While Troy Pelletier led Lehigh in receptions and yards in 2017, classmate Gatlin Casey emerged as a big play threat, leading the Mountain Hawks with 14 touchdown catches and a 18.3 yards-per-reception average. Casey had at least one touchdown catch in every game of Lehigh's nine-game win streak last season, highlighted by a four-touchdown effort (three receiving and one kickoff return) versus Colgate. In Lehigh's nine-game win streak, Casey averaged 5.8 catches for 113.7 yards and 1.6 touchdowns, while in the Mountain Hawks' three losses he averaged just 3.3 receptions for 37.3 yards and was kept out of the end zone. Casey earned first team All-Patriot League honors and wide receiver, and kick returner, where he averaged 24.5 yards per return.

WORKING OVERTIME

The Mountain Hawks have played 11 overtime games since overtime rules were established prior to the 1995 season. Lehigh is 7-4 in overtime games, with its most recent overtime game being the double overtime come-from-behind triumph versus Central Connecticut State in the 2013 season-opener. Lehigh also went to overtime on opening day in 1997, when the Mountain Hawks lost at Fordham.

SOMETHING TO BRAG ABOUT

After rushing for 1,008 yards and earning Patriot League Rookie of the Year honors as a freshman, tailback Dominick Bragalone put together another outstanding campaign in 2016, rushing for 1,171 yards and 14 touchdowns to earn first team All-Patriot League honors. Bragalone had four 100-yard rushing games, highlighted by a career-best 192-yard, three touchdown effort against Fordham. The South Williamsport, Pa. native owns 10 career 100-yard rushing games and joins Rabih Abdullah '97 as the only Lehigh runners to post two 1,000-yard rushing seasons. Bragalone begins the 2017 season 10th in school annals in career rushing yards.

TURNING THE TIDES ON TURNOVERS

Creating more turnovers defensively has been a major area of focus for the Mountain Hawks in recent years. After posting negative turnover margins and producing just 13 takeaways in both 2014 and 2015, Lehigh turned things around last season, posting a plus-9 turnover margin and creating 21 takeaways, including 17 interceptions. Lehigh picked off four passes (and added a fumble recovery) in a win at Holy Cross and also had three interceptions against Princeton and New Hampshire. Players accounting for nine of Lehigh's 17 interceptions return in 2017, led by junior Sam McCloskey, who led the Mountain Hawks with three.

JUST FOR KICKS

Following a strong freshman campaign as Lehigh's kicker, Ed Mish added punting duties to his plate and went on to earn first team All-Patriot League honors at both positions. Last year Mish was a perfect 62-for-62 on extra points, setting a single-season school record in the process. He also tied a school mark with nine PATs at Yale. A five-time Patriot League Special Teams Player of the Week, Mish scored 80 points in 2016 and averaged 43 yards per kick on 42 punts with 10 placed inside the opponents 20 yard line.

LEHIGH VS. THE CAA ON THE GRIDIRON

Lehigh is 3-12 against CAA opponents under Andy Coen. Coen's first win as a head coach was against Villanova in 2006. Lehigh lost its next seven games against CAA foes before beating Towson in the second round of the 2011 FCS playoffs and then defeating New Hampshire in 2013. The makeup of the CAA has changed in recent years with Massachusetts moving up to the FBS and Albany, Elon and Stony Brook joining the league for football.

JONES BACK IN THE FOLD

Lehigh's 2016 title run was accomplished without one of its top performers on defense, after Quentin Jones was lost for the season late in the Yale game with a head injury. The defensive back had 20 tackles through five games and after sitting out the remainder of the fall semester while recovering, returned to campus in the spring and is ready to go today. Jones led Lehigh with three interceptions as a sophomore. A three-year contributor, he has seen time at cornerback and safety and is expected to work at Lehigh's rover position in 2017.

KEEPING THE CHAINS MOVING

One of the main reasons for Lehigh's offensive success in 2016 was its ability to move the chains. After talling just 15 in a season-opening loss to Monmouth, the Mountain Hawks averaged 26.2 first downs over their next 11 games. Lehigh was also excellent on third downs, leading the Patriot League and ranking sixth nationally with a .491 conversion rate. Lehigh's 303 first downs ranked fifth in the FCS.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Following the 2016 season, Lehigh placed 23 student-athletes on the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll. Eighteen of those 23 selections are back this season, including fifth-year senior Jimmy Mitchell, who earned Academic All-Patriot League honors last season. Offensive lineman Micah Tennant '17 earned several major academic awards following the 2016 season including being recognized as a first team CoSIDA Academic All-American and the FCS ADA Scholar-Athlete of the Year. Junior linebacker Brian Olshanski leads the Mountain Hawks with a 3.68 GPA in finance, while among projected starters, junior defensive lineman Harrison Kauffman owns a 3.55, also in finance.

SCOUTING VILLANOVA

Villanova was picked third in the CAA preseason poll. The Wildcats went 9-4 in 2016, earning an at-large berth to the FCS playoffs. Villanova won its first round playoff game over Saint Francis before falling 10-7 at South Dakota State. The Wildcats return 15 starters led by safety Rob Rolle, who was named to the preseason watch list for the Buck Buchanan Award as the top defensive player in the FCS. Linebacker Ed Shockley and punter John Hinchen joined Rolle on the Preseason All-CAA team. Longtime Wildcat assistant Mark Ferrante makes his head coaching debut taking over for his mentor Andy Talley. Villanova returns its starting quarterback in junior Zach Bednarczyk, top rusher in Aaron Forbes as well as its top nine receivers in terms of receptions from a season ago. Wide receiver Brandon Chadbourn is the older brother of Lehigh freshman running back Evan Chadbourn.

Fordham was picked second and Colgate was picked third. Lehigh tied for third in the 2016 preseason poll and went on to go 6-0 in the league and win its 11th Patriot League football title.

POLL POSITION

When Lehigh's win streak reached six straight last season, the Mountain Hawks entered the national rankings for the first time since Nov. 25, 2013. LEHIGH HEAD COACH ANDY COEN



and passionate leader with a unique ability to motivate and inspire today's student-athletes, Andy Coen is in his 12th year as Lehigh's head football coach. During his time as the Mountain Hawks leader, Coen has produced 122 All-Patriot League honorees, 23 All-America selec-

tions and 219 Patriot League Academic Honor Roll student-athletes.

A two-time Patriot League Coach of the Year, Coen has guided Lehigh to four Patriot League titles in 11 seasons in Bethlehem. He was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award on three occasions, finishing seventh in 2010. sixth in 2011 and 11th last year.

In 11 seasons, Coen has amassed an overall record of 77-49 (.611) and a 47-19 (.712) mark against Patriot League foes. Late in the 2016 season, Coen passed the legendary John Whitehead and moved into second place on Lehigh's career coaching wins list. He enters 2017 eight wins behind Bill Leckonby for the top spot.

Coen led the Mountain Hawks to their 11th Patriot League title in 2016. After an 0-2 start, Lehigh reeled off nine consecutive victories, capped by a 45-21 win over rival Lafayette to cap an undefeated Patriot League season. Coen was named Patriot League Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award.

Thirteen players garnered All-Patriot League honors, led by quarterback Nick Shafnisky who was the league and ECAC Offensive Player of the Year. Wide receiver Troy Pelletier went on to earn the first All-America honors for a Lehigh football student-athlete since 2013.

Offensive lineman Micah Tennant and nose guard Jimmy Mitchell garnered Academic All-Patriot League honors, with Tennant also earning first team Academic All-America honors.

Lehigh finished 2015 with a 4-2 league mark. A 49-35 win over rival Lafayette, Lehigh's sixth in the last eight years over the Leopards clinched a winning campaign at 6-5. A balanced offensive attack kept Lehigh in every game with quarterback Nick Shafnisky leading the Patriot League's top-ranked offense. Freshman tailback Dominick Bragalone became the first Lehigh freshman to rush for more than 1,000 yards in a season and was named Patriot League and ECAC Rookie of the Year as well as being named a finalist for the FCS Freshman Player of the Year award.

Eight Mountain Hawks garnered All-Patriot League honors in 2015 with sophomore wide receiver Troy Pelletier and junior linebacker Colton Caslow recognized for the second time.

Academically, 22 student-athletes were named to the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll, with seniors Cody Kondas and Chris Ruhl earning Academic All-League recognition. Ruhl was also a CoSIDA Academic All-District selection.

Coen coached five All-Patriot League perform-

ers in 2014 including three-time All-League offensive tackle Ned Daryoush and punter Austin Devine. Pelletier was a finalist for the Jerry Rice Award, given to the nation's top freshman.

The Mountain Hawks posted their fourth consecutive winning season in 2013 with an 8-3 mark. Coen mentored nine All-Patriot League selections including wide receiver Lee Kurfis, who led the FCS in receiving yards per game and earned All-America honors

Under Coen's guidance, Lehigh posted its third consecutive ten win season in 2012. Lehigh posted its fifth straight win over Lafayette and finished in the top 20 of both national polls for the third straight season.

Coen coached 11 student-athletes to All-Patriot League honors, with a trio of seniors recognized as ECAC All-Stars. Seniors Zach Barket and Ryan Spadola were CoSIDA Academic All-District selections, while Barket became Coen's first Academic All-American

In 2011, Coen guided the Mountain Hawks to their best season in a decade, one that featured an 11-2 overall record, a 5-0 Patriot League record and Lehigh's league-leading tenth football championship. The Mountain Hawks won 10 straight games, including a 40-38 win at Towson in the second round of the NCAA playoffs. Lehigh finished in the top six in both polls and captured its eighth Lambert Cup en route to being named ECAC FCS Team of the Year.

With quarterback Chris Lum leading the way, Lehigh ranked among the top five nationally in passing offense and scoring offense. Lum finished second in the voting for the Walter Payton Award.

Five Mountain Hawks garnered All-America recognition, led by Lum and Spadola. Academically, Spadola and Barket were Academic All-District selections.

The 2010 season saw Coen guide the Mountain Hawks to their ninth league championship and Lehigh's first outright league title since 2001. The Mountain Hawks won ten games for the first time since 2001 and posted the first undefeated Patriot League season in seven years.

Lehigh qualified for the NCAA playoffs for the first time since 2004 and went on the road to defeat Northern Iowa 14-7 for the Patriot League's first playoff win in seven years, while finishing the season ranked 14th nationally. For his team's success, Coen was named Patriot League Coach of the Year.

Eighteen players were named to All-Patriot League teams, while four players earned All-America honors, including offensive lineman Will Rackley '11 who was Lehigh's first Associated Press first team All-America since 2004 and was drafted by the Jacksonville Jaguars in the third round of the NFL Draft.

The 2009 Mountain Hawks led the nation in sacks with 39 and ranked 12th in America in tackles-for-loss with 83. Linebacker Matt Cohen '10 became the first player during Coen's tenure to earn a major award from the Patriot League as he garnered Defensive Player of the Year accolades. Cohen went onto earn All-America laurels from four different outlets while Rackley was honored by one.

During the 2008 season, Coen led Lehigh to a 4-2 Patriot League mark, which included a 31-15 victory over archrival Lafayette. Nine players earned spots on the All-Patriot League teams, while four student-athletes garnered All-America accolades. Off the field, 12 Mountain Hawks were named to the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll, led by Brendan Van Ackeren '09 who also earned a spot on the ESPN

the Magazine Academic All-District Team.

In 2007, Lehigh ranked second in the Patriot League in scoring defense (21.1 ppg) and scored 30 or more points on four occasions, including a 45-0 shutout win over Georgetown – the program's first shutout victory since 2002. Coen coached 10 All-Patriot League selections and six All-Americans; marking the first time since 2004 Lehigh produced an All-American.

Coen led the Mountain Hawks to a share of the Patriot League Championship in his first-ever season as a head coach in 2006. The Mountain Hawks boasted a balanced attack on both sides of the ball, topping the Patriot League in scoring offense (27.2 ppg) and defense (20.2 ppg). The New Jersey native mentored 14 All-Patriot League selections.

Coen became the 28th head football coach in Lehigh history on January 3, 2006. That announcement marked his return to Lehigh, where he spent six seasons as an offensive line coach – including four as the team's offensive coordinator.

Coen returned to Lehigh from Penn, where he spent six years as the offensive coordinator with the Quakers. In his six seasons in Philadelphia, the Quakers captured three Ivy League titles, including a top ten national finish in 2003.

In his first stop at Lehigh (1994-99), Coen was a part of three Patriot League championship teams, including the 12-1 1998 squad. That team set a school mark for the most wins in a season, while reaching the NCAA Division I-AA quarterfinals.

Coen produced ten All-Patriot League offensive linemen at Lehigh, while his teams twice finished in the national top ten in passing offense (1996, 1998). During Coen's tenure as coordinator, Lehigh produced four consecutive 1,000-yard rushers, including Rabih Abdullah '97, who remains Lehigh's all-time leader in rushing yards (3,696). Abdullah later went on to become the first Lehigh player to win a Super Bowl as a member of the 2004 New England Patriots.

Before his original stint at Lehigh, Coen spent four seasons at the United States Merchant Marine Academy in Kings Point, N.Y. He also worked as a graduate assistant coach at Minnesota and James Madison.

A native of Cherry Hill, N.J., Coen earned his bachelors in history from Gettysburg College in 1986

Coen and his wife Laura have three children: a daughter, Molly and two sons, Nolan and Finn.
