SETTING THE SCENE

The Lehigh women's basketball team will host the 20th Christmas City Classic, presented by Best Western, this weekend at Stabler Arena. This year's tournament will feature Fairfield, New Hampshire and La Salle, all of whom will be making their second-ever appearance in the tournament.

Lehigh and Fairfield will play at 2 p.m. on Saturday, followed by UNH and La Salle at 4:30 p.m. The winners will meet on Sunday at 4:30 p.m. for the championship, which will follow the 2 p.m. consolation game.

Lehigh enters the weekend riding a two-game winning streak after picking up victories earlier this week against Cornell and Mansfield. Fairfield is coming off a win over Mount St. Mary's on Tuesday and is 1-3 this season. La Salle also sits a 1-3 with results that include two Patriot League games: a 74-47 win over Lafayette and a 66-44 setback to American. UNH is off to a 3-1 start to the season after making an appearance in the WNIT last season (26-8). The Wildcats earned a 72-57 win on Nov. 15 against league foe Boston U., with their only loss coming in a five-point setback at Xavier.

Lehigh is coming off a 77-47 win against Mansfield on Wednesday night at home, where three Mountain Hawks scored in double figures, led by senior Quinci Mann with 18 points and sophomore Camryn Buhr who picked up her first career double-double. Sophomore Camryn Benz added 10 points and classmate Hannah Hedstrom issued 12 assists, three shy of a school record.

IF LEHIGH BEATS FAIRFIELD

- Lehigh would advance to the championship of the Christmas City Classic for the 16th time in 20 years.
- Lehigh would top Fairfield for the third straight time and win its second game this season against a MAAC opponent.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH SUE TROYAN

Sue Troyan (Dickinson '88) is in her 23rd season at the helm of the Mountain Hawks, and carries a career record of 349-310 into Saturday's game. Since arriving in Bethlehem, she has turned the Lehigh program into a perennial Patriot League contender. A two-time Patriot League Coach of the Year, Troyan guided Lehigh to 19 wins and a Patriot League championship game appearance in 2014-15. Over the previous eight full seasons, Troyan has led Lehigh to a 167-114 record. She has led LU to three Patriot League Championships and NCAA Tournament berths during her tenure. Prior to becoming the head basketball coach, Troyan served as an assistant basketball coach and head softball coach at Lehigh, leading the softball team to a 126-90 record in five seasons.

ALL-TIME VS. FAIRFIELD

Lehigh and Fairfield will meet for the fifth time in school history. Lehigh holds a 3-1 record against the Stags and has won each of the last three meetings.

Lehigh won the most recent matchup 73-67 on Nov. 21, 2013 in Fair-field. Lehigh also beat the Stags 47-42 on Dec. 6, 2012 at Stabler Arena.

Lehigh beat Fairfield in their only previous trip to the Christmas City Classic with a 70-42 victory on Dec. 29, 2005. The Stags only victory in the series came in the first-ever matchup on Dec. 9, 1995 in Fairfield (64-62).

SCOUTING THE STAGS

Fairfield is off to a 1-3 start on the season and is coming off an 11-point victory over Mount St. Mary's on Tuesday. Sophomore Sam Kramer scored a career-high 27 points on 7-of-10 shooting in the win and tied the program record with seven three-pointers. In all, the team hit 11 three-pointers (in 27 attempts) and committed just nine turnovers while dishing out 23 assists.

Redshirt senior Samantha Cooper moved into the top-10 on the school's career rebounding list. She is tied for the team lead with Kramer in points per game (14.8 ppg) and also leads the team with 11.3 rebounds per game. She also has three double-doubles on the season.

Kramer leads the team from beyond the arc with a 48.3 3FG percentage, and is second on the team by shooting 46.8 percent from the field. Khadidiatou Diouf leads the team in shooting at 48.1 percent (25-for-52).

Much like the Mountain Hawks, the Stags also have two players from the state of Minnesota with Eden Nibbelink and Erika Schlosser. Fairfield was predicted to finish fourth in the MAAC Preseason Poll.

FAIRFIELD HEAD COACH JOE FRAGER

Now in his 11th season at Fairfield, Joe Frager holds a 189-131 record as the head coach of the Stags. He is the only coach in the history of the MAAC to have 10 consecutive winning season in conference play to begin his career.

All told, 35 student-athletes have been named to the MAAC All-Academic Team during his tenure.

Prior to Fairfield, Frager served as the head coach for nine seasons at Southern Connecticut State, leading the Owls to a NCAA D-II national championship in 2007. He previously had head coaching experience at Seymour (CT) High School and is a member of the New England Basketball Hall of Fame and the Connecticut Women's Basketball Hall of Fame.

Frager graduated from UConn in 1984 with a Bachelor's degree in political science and earned his master's in social sciences from Southern Connecticut State.

CLASSIC HISTORY

The 2017 Christmas City Classic will be held for the 20th time on Nov. 25 and 26 at Stabler Arena, and has been held each year (except 2014) since 1997. Lehigh has appeared in the championship game of the four-team tournament in 15 of the 19 CCC's, and has won four titles (2000, 2008, 2009, 2010). LU has gone 0-2 only twice in the tournament (1997 and 2016).

UNH, Fairfield and La Salle are all making their second-ever appearance in the tournament. UNH won The Classic in 2005 by knocking off Lehigh, who had beaten Fairfield in the opening round. La Salle fell to Lehigh in the finals in 2008.

TIS' THE SEASON OF GIVING

In Wednesday's win over Mansfield, Hannah Hedstrom dished out a career-high 12 assists, coming just three shy of tying the program single game record of 15 held by Patty Garnish (1976) and Hope Pellicane (1993). Hedstrom's previous career high was nine, which she accomplished last season against Delaware State.

As a team, Lehigh totaled 20 assists in the game, their most since they also had 20 against Lafayette on Jan. 27, 2016.

BIG GAME FOR BUHR

Sophomore Camryn Buhr recorded her first career double-double on Wednesday against Mansfield with 15 points and a career-high 11 rebounds. It marked Lehigh's first double-double since Gena Grundhoffer on Nov. 19, 2016 vs. Sacred Heart.

SAVING THE BEST FOR LAST

The Mountain Hawks are being outscored in each of the first three quarters this season, but have not been outscored in the fourth quarter of any game, besting their opponents by a wide margin of 103-81. Lehigh outscored Monmouth by nine, Cornell by seven and Mansfield by four in the fourth quarter to secure their three wins, and outscored Minnesota and Villanova by one in the final frame of their two losses.

BIG TURNAROUND ON THE BOARDS

Lehigh has yet to be outrebounded through its first five games, outrebounding Minnesota, Monmouth and Mansfield, and was even on the boards against Villanova and Cornell. Through the first five games, Lehigh holds a rebounding margin of +6.2, which ranks tied for second in the Patriot League. Lehigh also ranked second the Patriot League by collecting 43.6 rebounds per game. Last season, Lehigh's rebounding margin through its first three games was -37.0.

ROAD WARRIORS

Lehigh opened the season with four consecutive road games for just the second time in program history, going 2-2 on the trip. The only other time Lehigh played four straight games away from home to start a season was 1994-95, a year before Sue Troyan took over as head coach. Lehigh lost all four of those games by double digits.

ROUGH NIGHT FOR THE OFFENSE

Lehigh struggled offensively on Friday night vs. Villanova, shooting 23 percent from the field, making just 14 of 61 field goals. It was Lehigh's worst night shooting in both categories since a 53-37 home loss to Bucknell on Jan. 23, 2013 when LU shot just 20.7 percent overall (12-for-58).

SCORING HIGHS: THE GOOD AND BAD

In the season opener at Minnesota, Lehigh scored 73 points, their most ever against a power conference opponent. The 107 points allowed by the Mountain Hawks was also a program record for the most point allowed in a single game. It was just the fifth 100+ point game allowed by Lehigh, joining 101 to Florida Int 1 on 1/2/93, 103 to UConn on 3/15/97, 104 to La Salle on 2/19/77 and 106 to Richmond on 12/1/96.

EDUCATION DAY

On Dec. 6, the Lehigh women's basketball program will host the 8th annual Education Day at Stabler Arena against NJIT. Last year's event against Delaware State drew a crowd of 4,410. The number set a new Stabler Arena record for a women's basketball game, surpassing the previous benchmark of 4,078 which was set on Dec. 2, 2014 against Hampton.

PLAYING ON THE BIG STAGE

On Dec. 10, Lehigh will play LIU Brooklyn as part of a doubleheader at the Barclays Center, home of the Brooklyn Nets. This will mark the first time in program history Lehigh has played in an arena that served as the home for an NBA team at the time. Lehigh defeated NJIT 65-54 at the Prudential Center in Newark on Dec. 18, 2008, which two years later became the temporary home for the former New Jersey Nets. LU also played Villanova at PPL Center in Allentown, Pa. on Nov. 17.

BETHLEHEM, Pa. – Sophomore Camryn Buhr recorded her first career double-double, senior Quinci Mann had a game-high 18 points and sophomore Hannah Hedstrom dished out 12 assists to help Lehigh power past Mansfield 77-47 in Wednesday's home opener at Stabler Arena. Mann netted 18 points on 7-of-9 shooting and 3-of-4 from long range to go with five rebounds and two steals. Buhr tallied a double-double, Lehigh's first since early last season, with 15 points and a career-high 11 rebounds. Sophomore Camryn Benz also netted double figures with 10 points and six rebounds on 5-of-7 shooting. Hedstrom scored two points and collected three steals, while dishing out 12 assists, just three shy of the school's single game record. Junior Meagan Eripret scored seven points on 3-of-5 shooting and sophomore Paige Galiani tied her career-high with six points.

The Mountain Hawks (3-2) shot 45.9 percent as a team and an even 35 percent from three-point range. Lehigh also outrebounded Mansfield 50-30 and tallied a season-best seven blocks from six different players and a season-high eight steals. The Brown and White also dominated in the paint where they held a 38-14 advantage and outscored the Mountaineers 16-3 on second chance opportunities.

"Overall, it was an evenly distributed game," said head coach Sue Troyan. "A lot of different people got to step up and have an opportunity. We got to see some different combinations, so it was a pretty good pre-tournament game to get under our belt before having a day off for Thanksgiving."

Lehigh sped out of the gate with an 11-0 run after Mansfield opened the game with a bucket, courtesy of seven points from Mann, two from Gena Grundhoffer and two Buhr free throws. Mann answered a Mountaineer basket and free throw with her second triple of the game to make it a 14-6 Lehigh lead by the media timeout with 4:09 on the clock. Lehigh went on another 14-0 run over the final three minutes to take a 28-8 lead after one quarter. Bernadette Devaney highlighted the run with five straight points, including a three-pointer, and Mariah Sexe tallied three points during the run.

Lehigh shot 69.2 percent (9-for-13) in the opening 10 minutes and was 4-of-6 from long range, while also holding an 11-6 rebounding edge. Mann started the game red hot, going 5-for-5 in the first quarter with 14 points.

"There were moments that I thought we played really well," Troyan said. "They established themselves early in the game, in the first quarter. We played really strong defense and that got us out to a lead."

Lehigh extended the run to 14-0 after Sexe found Clougherty underneath for a layup. Mansfield broke the run by banking in a three-pointer to beat the shot clock at the 8:52 mark, which sparked an 8-0 run, before Mann weaved through the lane for a layup to make it 30-16 at 7:20. Mansfield outscored Lehigh 15-14 and took advantage of six Lehigh turnovers and a streak of 4-for-15 shooting in the frame to get within 12 points on two separate occasions, but Hedstrom used two free throws and Colins in the first of the second Lehigh the 40-22 adms used two free throws and Galiani's three-pointer with three seconds left gave Lehigh the 40-23 edge going into the locker room.

"There were times where we passed the ball well and really looked like a team, and there were times where we tried to do too much individually and the second quarter was an example of that," Troyan said.

Lehigh rebounded in the third quarter, starting the second half on a 6-0 run with buckets from Grundhoffer, Buhr and Mann to take a 46-23 lead and force a Mansfield timeout. Hedstrom assisted on a three-pointer from Mary Clougherty and then found Benz underneath for a lay in with 3:20 to go, moving her into double figures and set a new career high in assists, as Lehigh built a 58-32 lead through three quarters.

Lehigh kept the pressure on into the fourth, as Mansfield did not get within 22 points. Buhr upped the lead to 30 for the first time on a jumper with 4:11 remaining, and Sexe scored two of her five points on free throws with less than one second left to put the icing on the thirty-point win.
