SETTING THE SCENE

The Lehigh women's basketball team will look to get back on track Wednesday night as they close out a four-game homestand against Mount St. Mary's. Lehigh has gone 2-1 at Stabler Arena this season, including a win on Saturday over Fairfield in the Christmas City Classic, before falling in Sunday's championship game to La Salle. Down 21 points with six minutes left, the Mountain Hawks staged a furious rally to get within four with one minute left, before La Salle scored the last four points to hold on for the 69-61 win.

Sophomore Camryn Buhr averaged a team-best 16 points per game in the tournament to go with 4.5 rebounds and was named to the all-tournament team. Senior Quinci Mann scored 17 points against La Salle, nine of which came during the fourth quarter comeback attempt, and averaged 11.5 points over the two-game weekend. Freshman Mariah Sexe scored a career-high nine points in Lehigh's 56-53 win over Fairfield, and Buhr led all scorers with a career-high 22 points on 8-of-12 shooting.

Three of Lehigh's last four non-league games will come against a Northeast Conference opponent. LU has only played four games against the NEC over the last four seasons, all of which have resulted in Lehigh victories.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH SUE TROYAN

Sue Troyan (Dickinson '88) is in her 23rd season at the helm of the Mountain Hawks, and carries a career record of 350-311 into Wednesday's game. Since arriving in Bethlehem, she has turned the Lehigh program into a perennial Patriot League contender. A two-time Patriot League Coach of the Year, Troyan guided Lehigh to 19 wins and a Patriot League championship game appearance in 2014-15. Over the previous eight full seasons, Troyan has led Lehigh to a 167-114 record. She has led LU to three Patriot League Championships and NCAA Tournament berths during her tenure. Prior to becoming the head basketball coach, Troyan served as an assistant basketball coach and head softball coach at Lehigh, leading the softball team to a 126-90 record in five seasons.

ALL-TIME VS. MOUNT ST. MARY'S

The Mountain Hawks and Mountaineers will meet up for the 10th time in program history dating back to their first matchup on February 24, 1976 in Bethlehem, Pa., which the Mountaineers won by a score of 63-60. The two teams have met at least once in each decade since the inaugural matchup.

Last year's win gave Lehigh a 5-4 edge in the all-time series between the two programs.

Lehigh has won the last four meetings with the Mountaineers, including last year's matchup in Emmitsburg, Md. by a score of 74-57. The last matchup at Stabler Arena was on Nov. 19, 2013 with Lehigh pulling out a 95-67 victory, which is tied for the third most points ever scored by Lehigh in a single game, and is the most points scored against a Division I opponent in regulation.

Lehigh has only faced Mount St. Mary's three times on the road, holding a 2-1 record in those games. Lehigh is just 3-3 against the Mountaineers at Stabler Arena.

SCOUTING THE MOUNTAINEERS

Mount St. Mary's is off to a 0-5 start to the season, which includes defeats at No. 6 Notre Dame and Xavier. Wednesday's matchup with Lehigh will close out the Mountaineer's five game road trip to start the season before they host Loyola for their home opener on Saturday.

The Mountaineers are led by sophomores Kayla Agentowicz (12.4 ppg) and Ashlee White (10.6 ppg). Agentowicz enters the game with a teambest 54.5 percent field goal percentage and is also shooting 50 percent from beyond the arc. Senior Katrice Dickson averages 8.8 points per game is second on the team with 3.8 rebounds per game. Junior Juliette Lawless leads the team with 4.8 boards per game. Senior Caroline Hummell is also one of nine players back from last year's squad and is averaging 4.6 points and 2.0 rebounds per contest.

Agentowicz scored a career-high 24 points in last week's loss at Fair-field, which is the school's only common opponent so far this season. Agentowicz has scored at least 20 points in back-to-back games and is 17-for-27 over the last two games.

The Mountaineers were voted eighth in this year's Northeast Conference Preseason Poll.

MOUNT ST. MARY'S HEAD COACH MARIA MARCHESANO

In the midst of her first season as head coach, Maria Marchesano came to The Mount after serving as an associate head coach at IUPUI. Last season, she helped guide IUPUI to a program record 24 wins, its first appearance in the Horizon League championship game in 10 years and its first-ever berth in the WNIT.

Marchesano previously served as the head coach at Div. II Walsh University in Ohio for three years and was also the head coach at Urbana University.

Marchesano played four years of basketball and one year of softball at Butler, graduating as the second-best three-point shooter in program history.

Marchesano graduated from Butler in 2005 with a bachelor's degree in integrated communications. She received her master's degree in athletics administration from North Central University in 2013.

2017 X-MAS CLASSIC RECAP

Lehigh advanced to the finals of the Christmas City Classic for the 16th time in the 20-year history of the tournament. After holding off Fairfield 56-53 in the opening round, Lehigh rallied from a 21-point fourth quarter deficit to get within four points of La Salle, before eventually falling 69-61. Lehigh has won four titles, with the most recent coming in 2010.

Sophomore Camryn Buhr scored a career-high 22 points against Fairfield in Saturday's first round action and added 10 more on Sunday to be named to the all-tournament team. Buhr averaged 16 points, four rebounds, one assist and one steal over the two games.

TIS' THE SEASON OF GIVING

In Lehigh's win over Mansfield on Nov. 22, Hannah Hedstrom dished out a career-high 12 assists, coming just three shy of tying the program single-game record of 15 held by Patty Garnish (1976) and Hope Pellicane (1993). Hedstrom's previous career high was nine, which she accomplished last season against Delaware State.

As a team, Lehigh totaled 20 assists in the game, their most since they also had 20 against Lafayette on Jan. 27, 2016.

BIG WEEK FOR BUHR

In Lehigh's four games last week, Camryn Buhr averaged 14 points, 6.8 rebounds, while shooting 50 percent overall (19-for-38) and from three-point range (3-for-6). After tallying nine points and seven rebounds at Cornell, she recorded her first career double-double on Nov. 22 against Mansfield with 15 points and a career-high 11 rebounds. She followed that up with a career-high 22 points against Fairfield on Nov. 25 and was named to the all-tournament team at the Christmas City Classic. Buhr also received honorable mention accolades in the Patriot League Player of the Week voting.

FINISHING STRONG

The fourth quarter has been the Mountain Hawks best quarter this season, where they have outscored their opponents 141-110. Lehigh has also yet to be outscored in the fourth quarter of any game this season. On average, Lehigh is outscoring their opponents 20.1-15.7 in the fourth quarter.

CLOSING THE GAP

After giving up a program record 107 points in the season opener at Minnesota, Lehigh has held a scoring margin of +4.7 in their six game since. Overall, their margin of -0.9 ranks fifth in the Patriot League.

CRASHING THE BOARDS

Lehigh's game against La Salle on Nov. 26 was the first time in seven games this season that Lehigh was outrebounded. Through the first seven games, Lehigh holds a rebounding margin of +2.3, which ranks fourth in the Patriot League, and the team has climbed to has high as second in that category this season. Lehigh also ranks third in the PL in defensive rebounding (27.7) and fourth in offensive rebounds (12.0) per game.

Last season, Lehigh's rebounding margin through its first three games was -37.0.

ROAD WARRIORS

Lehigh opened the season with four consecutive road games for just the second time in program history, going 2-2 on the trip. The only other time Lehigh played four straight games away from home to start a season was 1994-95, a year before Sue Troyan took over as head coach. Lehigh lost all four of those games by double digits.

ROUGH NIGHT SHOOTING

Lehigh struggled offensively on Nov. 17 vs. Villanova, shooting 23 percent from the field, making just 14 of 61 field goals. It was Lehigh's worst night shooting in both categories since a 53-37 home loss to Bucknell on Jan. 23, 2013 when LU shot just 20.7 percent overall (12-for-58).

EDUCATION DAY

On Dec. 6, the Lehigh women's basketball program will host the 8th annual Education Day at Stabler Arena against NJIT. Last year's event against Delaware State drew a crowd of 4,410. The number set a new Stabler Arena record for a women's basketball game, surpassing the previous benchmark of 4,078 which was set on Dec. 2, 2014 against Hampton.

PLAYING ON THE BIG STAGEOn Dec. 10, Lehigh will play LIU Brooklyn as part of a doubleheader at the Barclays Center, home of the Brooklyn Nets. This will mark the first time in program history Lehigh has played in an arena that served as the home for an NBA team at the time. Lehigh defeated NJIT 65-54 at the Prudential Center in Newark on Dec. 18, 2008, which two years later became the temporary home for the former New Jersey Nets. LU also played Villanova at PPL Center in Allentown, Pa. on Nov. 17.

PATRIOT LEAGUE PRESEASON POLL

Lehigh was picked seventh in the Patriot League Preseason Poll and is looking to rebound after a ninth place finish in last year's Patriot League standings. LU fell in the first round of the league tournament to Loyola. It was the first time Lehigh had failed to qualify for at least the semifinals since the league went to the current tournament format in 2013-14.

LAST TIME OUT FOR LEHIGH

NOVEMBER 26, 2017 LA SALLE 69, LEHIGH 61

BETHLEHEM, Pa. – A furious 21-4 rally got the Lehigh women's basketball team within four points of La Salle with just over one minute left, but that was as close as they would get as the Explorers held on for the 69-61 victory in the finals of the Christmas City Classic, presented by Best Western. Senior Quinci Mann scored nine of her team-high 17 points in the fourth quarter, sophomore Hannah Hedstrom tallied 13 points on 5-of-7 shooting along with five rebounds, three assists and two steals. Cameryn Benz collected eight points and tied for the team lead with five boards. Camryn Buhr had 10 points and four rebounds and was named to the all-tournament team.

The Mountain Hawks (4-3) were outrebounded for the first time this season by a 42-25 margin. La Salle (3-3) shot 52.1 percent overall and connected on four of their seven three-point attempts. Lehigh went 35.5 percent from the field including a 2-for-18 mark from three-point range. Lehigh committed 13 turnover to La Salle's 24, 12 of which came in the fourth quarter. LU outscored La Salle 25-17 in particle of the property of t points off turnovers and also held a 38-36 edge in the paint.

"This is the kind of game where you will reveal your toughness," said head coach Sue Troyan. "I didn't think we shot the ball particularly well today, but I thought we really competed hard and fought our way back to make it a competitive game and give ourselves a chance."

Buhr scored Lehigh's first seven points out of the gate, capped with the three-pointer to tie the game at seven off a cross-court pass from Mann. Benz added four straight points off the bench to answer a La Salle run that gave the Explorers an 18-11 lead after one quarter.

Trailing 20-13 early in the second, Lehigh broke out on an 8-2 run to make it a 22-21 game at the 6:34 mark. The run featured jumpers from four different players, beginning with a tray from Meagan Eripret and ending on a Benz layup. La Salle answered in a big way, ending the half on a 12-3 run to hold a 10-point, 34-24 lead at halftime.

La Salle shot an even 50 percent in the opening half to Lehigh's 37 percent (10-for-27). Buhr tallied nine first half points to lead the team, while La Salle held a 20-12 edge on the glass.

"I thought we got disrupted in the post play," Troyan said. "I didn't think they got in a rhythm offensively. I thought their size and athleticism played a role in terms of our inability to knock down open shots. And it's the first time we played back-to-back games; we had some kids who logged big minutes yesterday they might have felt some of that today."

La Salle picked up right where it left off coming out of the locker room, extending the run to 16-3 over the first two minutes. Four quick points in transition to begin the period prompted a Lehigh timeout at the 7.58 mark with the score 38-24. The Explorers increased the lead to as much as 16 with a three-pointer in the closing seconds to hold a 56-40 lead through three quarters.

Tournament MVP Amy Griffin, who scored a game-high 24 points, gave La Salle a 21-point lead at 63-42 with 6:11 remaining. The Mountain Hawks exploded to score 21 of the next 25 points, starting with three straight baskets from Mary Clougherty, Hedstrom and Gena Grundhoffer. After a La Salle basket, Mann followed with five straight points and Grundhoffer hit two free throws to make it a 10-point game.

Following a flagrant foul on La Salle, Mann added two more from the line to make it 65-57 with 1:37 left, then tacked on a layup after the ensuing inbounds pass to make it a six-point game with 1:29 to go. After La Salle turned it over on the ensuing possession, Hedstrom stepped up and hit two free throws with 1:07 to play to make it 65-61. La Salle hit a free throw to get the lead back to five with 50 seconds left, then forced a Lehigh turnover and added another free throw with 26 seconds left. Lehigh would go on to miss two free throws moments later, and La Salle answered with two of their own to thwart the comeback and hold on for the 69-61 final.

Lehigh outscored La Salle 21-13 in the fourth quarter and forced 12 turnovers in the period. The Mountain Hawks have yet to be outscored in the fourth quarter in a game this season.

"It's a mindset," Troyan said. "I think they're in pretty good game shape and that helps. There's a sense of confidence in terms of getting it done and in one another to get the job done.

"We faced really good competition," Troyan said. "We faced teams from strong conferences that will compete and it will prepare us well for Patriot League play."
