SETTING THE SCENE

Coming off their best offensive night of the season, the Lehigh women's basketball team will head out on the road for a Sunday afternoon matchup at Sacred Heart. Lehigh is 3-1 away from Stabler Arena this season

The Mountain Hawks rallied for a 75-71 win over Mount St. Mary's on Wednesday evening, shooting 50 percent from the floor for the first time this season, and connecting on 53.5 percent of their three-pointers, their most made triples in a game since December 2010. Seniors Bernadette Devaney and Quinci Mann led the way with 20 points apiece and both set career-highs with six made three-pointers. Lehigh dished out 21 assists, their most since they recorded 24 against Bucknell in Feb. 26, 2014 with four different Mountain Hawks recorded at least four assists. Gena Grundhoffer added 12 points while shooting 50 percent and Camryn Buhr had a team-high six rebounds.

Mann's six three-pointers moved her into a tie for fourth on the school's all-time three-point list with 158, and moved her into the top five in scoring in the Patriot League this season with 14.4 points per game.

IF LEHIGH BEATS SACRED HEART

- Lehigh would start the season at least 6-3 for the fourth time in the last five seasons.
- Lehigh would win its seventh straight game over Northeast Conference opponents, with their last loss coming against Sacred Heart on Dec. 20, 2012.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH SUE TROYAN

Sue Troyan (Dickinson '88) is in her 23rd season at the helm of the Mountain Hawks, and carries a career record of 351-311 into Sunday's game. Since arriving in Bethlehem, she has turned the Lehigh program into a perennial Patriot League contender. A two-time Patriot League Coach of the Year, Troyan guided Lehigh to 19 wins and a Patriot League championship game appearance in 2014-15. Over the previous eight full seasons, Troyan has led Lehigh to a 167-114 record. She has led LU to three Patriot League Championships and NCAA Tournament berths during her tenure. Prior to becoming the head basketball coach, Troyan served as an assistant basketball coach and head softball coach at Lehigh, leading the softball team to a 126-90 record in five seasons.

ALL-TIME VS. SACRED HEART

The Mountain Hawks and Pioneers will meet up for the 11th time in program history dating back to their first matchup on January 9, 1999, which the Mountain Hawks won by a score of 76-73. Lehigh holds a 6-4 edge in the all-time series.

The two teams have split the last four matchups between them. Lehigh has won two in a row in the series: a 68-62 win at Stabler Arena last season, and an 85-77 win in Fairfield in 2014.

SHU's Katherine Haines led all scorers with 20 points in last year's matchup at Stabler, shooting 8-for-11 overall and pulling down a team-high eight rebounds. Tykera Carter also scored in double figures with 13 points and a trio of three-pointers.

Lehigh's Gena Grundhoffer picked up her first career double-double with 19 points and 11 rebounds in the win, while Cameryn Benz scored 10 points and Quinci Mann added nine.

Lehigh is 3-2 against the Pioneers all-time at Stabler Arena and is 3-2 at the Pitt Center.

SCOUTING THE PIONEERS

Sacred Heart enters Sunday's matchup at 2-4 this season, and is coming off an 86-81 double overtime defeat to Hofstra on Thursday night. Sacred Heart and Lehigh have one common opponent this season. The Pioneers opened the season with a 69-64 loss at Monmouth, while Lehigh defeated Monmouth 75-57, also on the road.

After picking up a four-point win at Manhattan on Nov. 15, the Pioneers dropped a 70-62 decision at Harvard, before winning at Florida A&M and falling 101-52 at Florida State during a two-game Thanksgiving weekend trip to the Sunshine State.

SHU is averaging 66.2 points per game this season and has five players averaging in double figures, led by redshirt sophomore Candice Leatherwood at 17.3 ppg. Redshirt sophomore Katherine Haines, who scored 20 points against Lehigh last season, averages 14.0 ppg and a team-best 9.8 rebounds. Junior Erin Storck comes in at 13.8 ppg, Tykera Carter scores 11.0 per game and freshman Adrianne Hagood, who made her first career start against Hofstra, is scoring 10.8 ppg.

As a team, SHU is shooting 39.2 percent overall and 27.1 percent from three-point land. Haines (55.1 percent) and Leatherwood (52.3 percent) are both shooting over 50 percent, while Storck (45.2) and Carter (43.4) both hitting at over 40 percent. Defensively, Haines lead the way with 9.8 rebounds and is tied for a team-best four total blocks. The Pioneers have struggled on the glass, accumulating a -9.7 rebounding margin. The Pioneers have outrebounded their opponents in their two wins, and have been outrebounded in their four losses.

On Thursday vs. Hofstra, Haines came off the bench to score 23 points on 11-of-17 shooting, along with 10 rebounds for the double-double. Leatherwood added 21 points on 7-for-11 from the field. Hofstra held a 55-36 edge on the boards, while connecting on 42 percent of their shots to SHU's 41 percent.

SACRED HEART HEAD COACH JESSICA MANNETTI

Jessica Mannetti is in her fifth year behind the Sacred Heart bench. Mannetti was named the NEC Coach of the Year in 2016 and has led the Pioneers to back-to-back WNIT appearances. She has help mentor eight All-NEC players and has led the team to appearances in the NEC Tournament in each of her first four seasons. Overall, the Pioneers have appeared in the NEC Tournament 18 years in a row.

Prior to Sacred Heart, Mannetti spent four years as an assistant coach at Hofstra, helping to lead the Pride to a 72-55 record and two WNIT berths.

LIVING DOWNTOWN

Lehigh is coming off its best shooting night of the season against Mount St. Mary's, when they shot 50 percent overall and 56.5 percent from three-point range. Lehigh drained 13 thrée-pointers in the game, their most since they made 13 against Binghamton on Dec. 4,

BERN BABY BERN

Senior Bernadette Devaney scored a career-high 20 points on Wednesday against Mount St. Mary's, besting her previous career-high of 13, which she had done three times. She also knocked down a career-best six three pointers on 6-of-8 shooting and 6-of-9 overall.

MOVING UP THE LIST

Senior Quinci Mann had a career-high six three-pointers on Wednesday against Mount St. Mary's. In doing so, she moved into a tie for fourth on Lehigh's all-time three-point list, and enters Sunday with 158 for her career. She also now ranks fifth in the Patriot League with 14.4 ppg.

2017 X-MAS CLASSIC RECAP

Lehigh advanced to the finals of the Christmas City Classic for the 16th time in the 20-year history of the tournament. After holding off Fairfield 56-53 in the opening round, Lehigh rallied from a 21-point fourth quarter deficit to get within four points of La Salle, before eventually falling 69-61. Lehigh has won four titles, with the most recent coming in 2010.

Sophomore Camryn Buhr scored a career-high 22 points against Fairfield in Saturday's first round action and added 10 more on Sunday to be named to the all-tournament team. Buhr averaged 16 points, four rebounds, one assist and one steal over the two games.

TIS' THE SEASON OF GIVING

Sophomore Hannah Hedstrom is averaging 6.75 assists per game over the last four contests. In Lehigh's win over Mansfield on Nov. 22, she dished out a career-high 12 assists, coming just three shy of tying the program's single-game record of 15 held by Patty Garnish (1976) and Hope Pellicane (1993). Hedstrom also registered a pair of six-assist games against Fairfield on Nov. 25 and Mount St. Mary's on Nov. 29.

BIG WEEK FOR BUHR

In Lehigh's four games last week, Camryn Buhr averaged 14 points, 6.8 rebounds, while shooting 50 percent overall (19-for-38) and from three-point range (3-for-6). After tallying nine points and seven rebounds at Cornell, she recorded her first career double-double on Nov. 22 against Mansfield with 15 points and a career-high 11 rebounds. She followed that up with a career-high 22 points against Fairfield on Nov. 25 and was named to the all-tournament team at the Christmas City Classic. Buhr also received honorable mention accolades in the Patriot League Player of the Week voting.

FINISHING STRONG

The fourth quarter has been the Mountain Hawks best quarter this season, where they have outscored their opponents 162-126. Lehigh has also yet to be outscored in the fourth quarter of any game this season and is currently being outscored by their opponents in all other quarters. On average, Lehigh is outscoring the opposition 20.3-15.8 in the fourth

CLOSING THE GAP

After giving up a program record 107 points in the season opener at Minnesota, Lehigh has held a scoring margin of +4.6 in their seven game since. Overall, they hold a scoring margin of -0.2.

CRASHING THE BOARDS

Lehigh's game against La Salle on Nov. 26 is the only time in eight games this season that Lehigh has been outrebounded. Through the first eight games, Lehigh holds a rebounding margin of +2.2, which ranks fourth in the Patriot League, and the team has climbed to has high as second in that category this season. Lehigh also ranks third in the PL in defensive

Last season, Lehigh's rebounding margin through its first three games was -37.0.

ROAD WARRIORS

Lehigh opened the season with four consecutive road games for just the second time in program history, going 2-2 on the trip. The only other time Lehigh played four straight games away from home to start a season was 1994-95, a year before Sue Troyan took over as head coach. Lehigh lost all four of those games by double digits.

ROUGH NIGHT SHOOTING

Lehigh struggled offensively on Nov. 17 vs. Villanova, shooting 23 percent from the field, making just 14 of 61 field goals. It was Lehigh's worst night shooting in both categories since a 53-37 home loss to Bucknell on Jan. 23, 2013 when LU shot just 20.7 percent overall (12-for-58).

EDUCATION DAY

On Dec. 6, the Lehigh women's basketball program will host the 8th annual Education Day at Stabler Arena against NJIT. Last year's event against Delaware State drew a crowd of 4,410. The number set a new Stabler Arena record for a women's basketball game, surpassing the previous benchmark of 4,078 that was set on Dec. 2, 2014 against Hampton.

PLAYING ON THE BIG STAGEOn Dec. 10, Lehigh will play LIU Brooklyn as part of a doubleheader at the Barclays Center, home of the Brooklyn Nets. This will mark the first time in program history Lehigh has played in an arena that served as the home for an NBA team at the time. Lehigh defeated NJIT 65-54 at the Prudential Center in Newark on Dec. 18, 2008, which two years later became the temporary home for the former New Jersey Nets. LU also played Villanova at PPL Center in Allentown, Pa. on Nov. 17.

PATRIOT LEAGUE PRESEASON POLL

Lehigh was picked seventh in the Patriot League Preseason Poll and is looking to rebound after a ninth place finish in last year's Patriot League standings. LU fell in the first round of the league tournament to Loyola. It was the first time Lehigh had failed to qualify for the league tournament to Loyola. at least the semifinals since the league went to the current tournament format in 2013-14.

NOVEMBER 29, 2017 LEHIGH 75, MOUNT ST. MARY'S 71

BETHLEHEM, Pa. – The senior duo of Bernadette Devaney and Quinci Mann rallied the Lehigh women's basketball team past Mount St. Mary's 75-71 in a back-and-forth tilt at Stabler Arena on Wednesday. Both scored 20 points and set career-highs with six three-pointers in a game that had 15 lead changes and 24 combined three-pointers. Devaney's 20-point game was also a career-high as she went 6-for-9 overall and 6-for-8 from three-point range in 20 minutes off the bench. Mann was 7-for-11 overall and 6-for-9 from the outside.

Sophomore Gena Grundhoffer also netted double figures with 12 points and shot 50 percent on the night. Sophomore Camryn Buhr added eight points and a team-high six rebounds. As a team, Lehigh shot a season-best 50 percent (29-for-58) from the field and 56.5 percent (13-for-23) from three-point range. The Mount connected on 42.6 percent (26-for-61) of their shots and 45.8 percent from three-point range. Lehigh also outrebounded the Mountaineers 32-30 and held a 28-22 advantage in the paint. Lehigh moves to 5-3 on the season, while The Mount falls to 0-6.

Both teams started the game hot on the offensive end, with the lead changing hands six times through the first 10 minutes. Mann gave Lehigh a two-point lead with a three-pointer to make it 9-7. After Lehigh went up 12-11, the Mountaineers once again answered with five straight to make it 17-11, before Mariah Sexe put in a layup to make it a four-point game late in the quarter. MSM's Katrice Dickson scored 12 of the Mountaineer's first 17 points within the first seven minutes before being held scoreless the rest of the game.

"We did adapt to the zone defense, we just hadn't seen a lot of it this year," said head coach Sue Troyan. "They played almost the entire 40 minutes in a zone and to our kids' credit, I thought they adapted within the game pretty well. Give both Quinci and Bernie credit; I thought they shof the ball really well for us."

Mann hit a three-pointer to make it 17-16 to start the second, before The Mount went on a 9-2 run to go up 26-18. Devaney answered with her second three of the game at the 6:00 mark to make it 26-21. The Mount built the lead to a game-high 11 points at 32-21 following two free throws coming out of the media timeout, before Lehigh scored six straight on layups from Cameryn Benz, Meagan Eripret and Grundhoffer. The Mount broke the run with a three-pointer and held an eight point lead with one minute to go, before an Eripret layup and a Mary Clougherty three-pointer to beat the buzzer got the Mountain Hawks to within 38-35 at halftime.

"We shot the ball pretty well," Troyan said. "If you want to go zone against us, we have personnel that make it tough to zone because we have two or three three-point shooters that can really knock it down. We've got good inside post play and posts that can step out and shoot it so it's kind of a pick-your-poison."

Both teams traded baskets to begin the third as Mann hit her third triple of the game to make it 45-42, and moments later Mae Williams got an offensive rebound and putback basket to make it 45-44, forcing a Mountaineer timeout with 6:42 remaining in the third. After a three-pointer, Grundhoffer hit a foul line jumper to make it a two-point ballgame and Mann gave Lehigh the lead at 49-48 with a triple at 4:36. After allowing seven straight points to fall behind, Lehigh got within one with just under a minute to go off a triple from Devaney to make it 55-54 entering the fourth.

Mann hit her fifth three of the night and Grundhoffer followed with a layup to give Lehigh a 59-55 lead in the opening minutes of the fourth. The Mount answered with another long 9-0 run to go back on top 64-59 before Devaney hit a three to make it 63-62 with 6:11 to go.

The lead traded hands five more times over the next five minutes. A Buhr layup with 1:38 to go put LU up 70-68, before Daly Sullivan responded with a three that put Lehigh in a 71-70 hole. Moments later, Devaney answered with her sixth three-pointer of the night to give Lehigh a 73-71 lead. After three successive turnovers, The Mount committed five fouls in eight seconds to send the Mountain Hawks to the free throw line, where Devaney iced the game away with two free throws with 8.6 seconds left to lock down the four-point win.

"For Bernie's confidence, it was really important," Troyan said. "She's one of the best shooters on our team but has struggled early this season. It was a big game for her to see those shots go down and then to hit the free throws down the stretch as well. We really need her coming off the bench and giving us a big lift. She's somebody that can score and distribute the ball, and can bring strong leadership to the floor.

"It was an important win for us, to be in a game down the stretch," Troyan added. "We were down one with about a minute and a half to go and Bernie hit a big three. That got us the lead there and we were able to hold on from there. That was a good sign of growth and maturity too for our team."
