### LEHIGH AND RUTGERS TO SQUARE OFF IN NCAA TOURNEY

The No. 8 ranked (and seeded) Lehigh men's lacrosse team will look to regroup from the disappointment of Sunday's cancellation of the Patriot League Championship Game and leave it all on the field on Saturday when the Mountain Hawks face ninth-ranked and unseeded Rutgers in the First Round of the NCAA Tournament. Gametime at UVA's Klößner Stadium is set for 2:30 p.m. on ESPNU. This marks Lehigh's third trip to the NCAA Tournament in the last nine seasons and first since 2013.

Lehigh is seeded for the second time in three NCAA appearances, along with a No. 7 seed in 2012 in which the Mountain Hawks dropped a 10-9 heartbreaker to eventual national finalist Maryland behind a goal with six seconds remaining. Lehigh was unseeded in 2013 and played at fifth-seeded North Carolina. Those marked the program's first two NCAA Tournament appearances in program history. The Mountain Hawks will be searching for their first-ever NCAA Tournament win on Saturday.

The Mountain Hawks enter the tournament with a 10-1 record (good for the nation's second best winning percentage, only behind Maryland) and winners of 14 of their last 15 games dating back to last season. Lehigh held the nation's longest active win streak (13 games) before its loss at No. 16 Villanova on May 1. Last weekend, Lehigh defeated Colgate in the Patriot League Semifinals, 13-9, before Sunday's title game was cancelled due to a positive COVID-19 test among Loyola's tier 1 testing pool. The no-contest meant the Mountain Hawks earned the league's automatic qualifier to the NCAA Tournament, while preventing Lehigh from playing for its first Patriot League Tournament Championship since 2013.

In Friday's semifinals, sophomore and first team All-Patriot League midfielder John Sidorski paced the offense with three goals (for his first-career hat trick) and three assists for a career-high tying six points. Junior Mike Sisselberger won 18-of-25 faceoffs last Friday (in what statistically was one of his "worst" performances of the season) to reach 210 faceoff wins this season - needing just five more to move into second place in program history for career faceoff victories. He's also up to 149 groundballs in 2021, needing just four to break teammate Conor Gaffney's program and Patriot League record. Sisselberger's 79.5 percentage for the season would be an NCAA record if the season ended today (the record is currently 79.1 by Albany's TD Ierlan in 2018).

Lehigh will shift its focus to Rutgers on Saturday, which will see junior Cole Kirst face his brothers Colin and Connor on the Scarlet Knights. Cole was named a second team All-Patriot League honoree while Colin and Connor were both named first team All-Big Ten. Colin was a four-year team member of the Mountain Hawks before transferring to Rutgers for his fifth year, and he's thrived, also being named Big Ten Specialist of the Year behind a 54.9 save percentage. The Mountain Hawks and Scarlet Knights last played in 2019 (when Colin was on Lehigh), as a Tommy Schelling go-ahead goal with 2:19 remaining helped Lehigh to a 13-10 win on the road. The year prior, Rutgers pulled out a slim 8-7 final in Bethlehem.

Rutgers has only faced Big Ten opponents this season while the Mountain Hawks have played only two nonleague games (NJIT and Villanova). The winner of Saturday's game will advance to the NCAA Quarterfinals against the

## SISSELBERGER AND CASSESE EARN MAJOR PATRIOT LEAGUE AWARDS; SEVEN NAMED ALL-LEAGUE

BETHLEHEM, Pa. – After a 9-1 regular season (8-0 in the Patriot League), the Lehigh men's lacrosse team garnered a number of postseason awards on Tuesday. Junior Mike Sisselberger was named Patriot League Faceoff Specialist of the Year while head coach Kevin Cassese was named Coach of the Year. In addition, seven Mountain Hawks were named All-League (four named first team and three named second team).

The seven All-League honorees mark Lehigh's most since 2013 and four first-team honorees are the most since 1995.

Sisselberger is Lehigh's second straight Faceoff Specialist of the Year, following teammate Conor Gaffney in 2019. Sisselberger has dominated at the faceoff X in 2021, standing No. 1 nationally in faceoff percentage (80.3) and groundballs per game (13.5). His 135 groundballs this season are 17 from tying teammate Gaffney's program record of 152 in 2019. Sisselberger also has four goals and one assist. He's won 84-of-100 faceoffs over the last four games, and has won at least 16 faceoffs (with no more than seven losses) in all 10 games. He's won each of the last five Patriot League Faceoff Specialist of the Week awards to up his season total to six, a new league record (breaking the previous mark held by Navy's Joe Varello in 2017).

Cassese was named Coach of the Year for the second time in his career (also 2013) after leading the Mountain Hawks to their most Patriot League wins in program history and first undefeated regular-season league record since 2013. Among Lehigh's victories were wins over then No. 10 Loyola, No. 7 Army West Point and No. 19 Navy. With the Mountain Hawks' win over Lafayette on Apr. 18, Cassese became the program's all-time leader in career victories. Lehigh went on to beat Bucknell on Apr. 24, good for Cassese's 117th career win. The Mountain Hawks won nine straight games to begin the season (to tie the program record for win streak within a season), extending their overall win streak to 13 dating back to 2020, which stood as the No. 1 streak in the nation.

Along with Sisselberger, juniors Tommy Schelling and Anthony Tangredi, and sophomore John Sidorski were also named first team All-Patriot League honorees.

Named to the Tewaaraton Award Watch List earlier this season, Schelling leads the Mountain Hawks in assists (22) and points (45), standing 19th nationally in points per game (4.50) and 21st nationally in assists per contest (2.20). He posted five or more points in seven of the 10 regular-season games, including two seven-point efforts. Schelling was named Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week following five goals and one assist at Colgate.

A preseason honorable mention All-American by Inside Lacrosse, Tangredi has helped anchor Lehigh's defense. The team leader in caused turnovers with 13, Tangredi had seven caused turnovers in the Mountain Hawks' 18-6 win at Bucknell, which was one shy of tying the program and NCAA record. He also had three groundballs and three caused turnovers in the 10-6 win over No. 10 Loyola, also causing turnovers against Army, Navy and Villanova. Schelling was a postseason honorable mention All-American following the pandemic-shortened 2020 season with 16 caused turnovers in six games; the 2.67 caused turnovers per contest were second nationally.

Sidorski stands fourth on the Mountain Hawks with 26 points via eight goals and 18 assists. The 18 assists were good for second on the team. Sidorski had four or more points in four contests – vs. NJIT (four assists), Bucknell (one goal, three assists), Colgate (two goals, two assists) and Army (two goals, four assists). Sidorski has also collected 13 groundballs.

Graduate student Andrew Eichelberger, senior Teddy Leggett and junior Cole Kirst were all named second team All-Patriot League.

Eichelberger's All-League honor is the second of his career and second straight. This season, he's tied for seventh on the team in points with 12 via 10 goals and two assists. The two-time captain is tied for fifth on the Mountain Hawks with his 10 goals. Among his highlights was a hat trick on Senior Day against Lafayette, and at least one goal in seven of the 10 contests.

Kirst was named All-Patriot League for the first time following a breakout campaign. The junior stands second on the Mountain Hawks with 24 goals and third with 30 points, while also adding 17 groundballs and three caused turnovers. Kirst began the season with seven straight multi-goal games and has had multiple points in all 10 contests. Kirst twice scored four goals – vs. Army West Point (to earn Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week honors) and at Lafayette (when he added an assist for a career-high five points). Kirst has recorded five hat tricks in 2021 after none his first two seasons.

Leggett earned All-League honors for the third time in as many seasons (no awards were presented in 2020). Also a two-time captain, Leggett stands second on the Mountain Hawks with 35 groundballs this season and second on the team with nine caused turnovers. He's a key part of Lehigh's faceoff game, which is No. 1 nationally. Leggett also has two assists this season. He owns 201 career groundballs, seventh in program history, including a season-high six in both the season opener and regular season finale.

## THREE NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-LEAGUE

BETHLEHEM, Pa. – A trio of Lehigh men's lacrosse student-athletes have been named to the Academic All-Patriot League team, as graduate student Conor Gaffney earned the honor for a third straight season while graduate student Andrew Eichelberger and junior Tommy Schelling were named Academic All-League for the first time. Gaffney is a two-time Scholar-Athlete of the Year while Eichelberger and Schelling were both named All-Patriot League for their on-field performance in 2021. The three honorees are tied for a program record.

In the classroom, Gaffney owns a 4.0 grade point average in graduate school after ending his undergraduate career with a 3.95 as a double major in mechanical engineering and integrated business and engineering (finance). Gaffney is a three-time CoSIDA Academic All-American (being named to the second team in 2020 as one of just four Division I men's lacrosse student-athletes recognized as Academic All-America). Gaffney is a two-time candidate for the prestigious Senior CLASS Award and multi-time winner of the team's Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award. Gaffney is a member of the Tau Beta Pi Engineering Honor Society, Pi Tau Sigma Mechanical Engineering Honor Society and American Society of Mechanical Engineers (ASME). He won the Elisha P. Wilbur Mathematics Award for the top performance in first-year engineering mathematics courses. Gaffney is back at Lehigh for a fifth year via the President's Scholarship program, which recognizes outstanding academic achievement by undergraduate students by providing a fifth year of study free of tuition.

Selected in the recent Premiere Lacrosse League Collegiate Draft (the Mountain Hawks' first-ever selection), Gaffney was named the 2019 Patriot League Faceoff Specialist of the Year and an honorable mention postseason All-American by both the USILA and Inside Lacrosse. Gaffney was a preseason honorable mention All-American by Inside Lacrosse this season. Gaffney is backing up junior Mike Sisselberger this year, who owns the nation's No. 1 faceoff percentage (80.3 percent, which if the season ended today, would be an NCAA record).

Eichelberger owns an impressive 3.88 GPA in his technical entrepreneurship master's program. He was named to the Dean's List this fall semester. As an undergrad, Eichelberger was named to the Dean's List (for a semester GPA over 3.6), named to the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll and garnered the Faculty Athletics Council Award (for a semester GPA over 3.2).

On the field, Eichelberger was named second team All-Patriot League this season. Also named to the second team in 2019, the midfielder is a two-time team captain. Eichelberger is tied for seventh on team in points (12) and fifth in goals (10), tallying a hat trick on Senior Day against Lafayette. He has at least one goal in seven of 10 games.

Schelling owns a strong 3.41 GPA in mechanical engineering. He's been named to the Dean's List on multiple occasions and posted a perfect 4.0 GPA this fall semester. He was named to the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll after each of his first two years, and has garnered the Faculty Athletics Council Award.

Schelling was named first team All-Patriot League this season, as he leads the Mountain Hawks in assists (22) and points (45). He stands 19th nationally in points per game (4.50) and 21st nationally in assists per game (2.20). Schelling posted five or more points in seven of the 10 games, including two seven-point efforts. He was named Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week following five goals and one assist at Colgate.



## ALL-TIME VS. RUTGERS

Lehigh beat Rutgers in the last meeting on Mar. 12, 2019, snapping a 14-game losing streak in the all-time series that dated back to 1962. Then freshman Tommy Schelling scored the go-ahead goal with 2:19 remaining. Overall, the Scarlet Knights lead the all-time series, 39-10-1. Lehigh and Rutgers also met in 2018, a tight 8-7 Scarlet Knights' victory. It was only the third meeting between the two schools since 1971. Prior to 2018, the teams hadn't played since Apr. 11, 1990, a 21-6 Rutgers win. Lehigh's last win was in 1961, an 8-7 final. The first-ever game between the sides came in 1887, a 12-0 Lehigh win. It came in Lehigh Lacrosse's third season; it was the program's fifth-ever game and first shutout.

## SCOUTING THE SCARLET KNIGHTS

Rutgers began its season with wins over then No. 6 ranked teams - Penn State (11-9) and Ohio State (22-12). The Scarlet Knights finished the regular season against their Big Ten only schedule 8-2, with the only losses coming to undefeated Maryland. Rutgers dropped its Big Ten Semifinal to Johns Hopkins, 12-10. Lehigh transfer and fifth year Colin Kirst has played a big role in the team's success, posting an 11.27 goals against average and 54.9 save percentage to earn Big Ten Specialist of the Year honors. His brother Connor transferred from Villanova for his fifth year and is second on the team in goals (32) and points (47) out of the midfield. Adam Charalambides leads Rutgers in goals (37) and points (53) while Kieran Mullins has recorded 25 goals and a team-leading 20 assists for 45 points. Saturday features the No. 4 and 5 scoring offenses in the nation with Lehigh at 14.91 goals per game and Rutgers at 14.82.

## SCARLET KNIGHTS LAST TIME OUT...

STATE COLLEGE, PA. (5/6/21) - No. 6 Rutgers men's lacrosse fell in the Big Ten Semifinals on Thursday night, dropping the contest to No. 20 Johns Hopkins by a 12-10 final score. Adam Charalambides and Connor Kirst each scored twice for RU as eight different players scored for RU. Colin Kirst made 12 saves, reaching double-figure saves for the 10th time this season.

## GAFFNEY SELECTED IN PLL COLLEGIATE DRAFT

Lehigh men's lacrosse's all-time career leader for faceoff wins and groundballs, graduate student Conor Gaffney became the program's first-ever PLL Collegiate Draft selection on Monday night, as he went 21st overall to the Archers. Gaffney has enjoyed a decorated collegiate career as a two-time first team All-Patriot League honoree, a 2019 All-American and Patriot League Faceoff Specialist of the Year.

## LEGGETT NAMED FINALIST FOR SENIOR CLASS AWARD

For the second time in three years, Lehigh men's lacrosse has a Senior CLASS Award finalist, as Teddy Leggett was named one of 10 finalists on Thursday. Leggett follows Craig Chick (2019), Ty Souders (2014) and Jonathan Stumpf (2011) as one of four finalists in program history. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. No finalists were named in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic, so the Mountain Hawks have featured a finalist in each of the last two seasons. The only other program who can say that is Virginia.

Lehigh has a strong tradition of Senior CLASS Award honorees. In 2021, Leggett and Conor Gaffney were the only two candidates from the Patriot League. The Mountain Hawks have had at least one candidate in eight of the last nine years (with 11 honorees in that time). Lehigh is also the only men's lacrosse program in the country with multiple honorees in three straight years.

Gaffney and Andrew Pettit were both named candidates last year (Gaffney was eligible again in 2021 since

Previous Lehigh Senior CLASS Award candidates were Cody Triolo in 2017, Casey Eidenshink in 2016, Dan Taylor in 2015, Ty Souders in 2014, Ryan Snyder in 2013 and Jonathan Stumpf in 2011. Chick, Souders and Stumpf were all named finalists.

## ALL-AROUND TEAM

The Mountain Hawks stand top 20 nationally in scoring offense (fourth, 14.91) and scoring defense (13th, 10.00). Lehigh is also No. 1 in faceoff win percentage as a team (74.6) while senior James Spence is top 15 in goals against average (9.62) and save percentage (55.6). ## THREE MID-SEASON ALL-AMERICAN MOUNTAIN HAWKS

Inside Lacrosse announced its midseason All-Americans in early April, which featured a trio of Lehigh men's lacrosse standouts. Junior faceoff specialist Mike Sisselberger was named to the first team, senior goaltender James Spence to the second team and junior defenseman Anthony Tangredi to the third team. Those three have been integral in the Mountain Hawks' 5-0 record, as one of just four undefeated teams in the nation entering the weekend. The midseason All-Americans were voted on by members of the media.

## MOUNTAIN HAWKS PICKED THIRD; FOUR PRESEASON ALL-LEAGUE

With the 2021 season set to begin this month, the Patriot League preseason poll and individual preseason honors were announced on Friday. The Lehigh men's lacrosse team was predicted to finish third while four (graduate student Andrew Eichelberger, graduate student Conor Gaffney, senior Teddy Leggett and junior Tommy Schelling) were named preseason All-Patriot League.

The Mountain Hawks finished with 104 points and one first-place vote, only behind Loyola with 125 (13 first-place votes) and Army West Point with 111 (four). Following Lehigh was Navy (77), Boston University (67), Bucknell (66), Holy Cross (40), Colgate (39) and Lafayette (19).

## EICHELBERGER, LEGGETT, DOUGLAS NAMED CAPTAINS

Lehigh head men's lacrosse coach Kevin Cassese announced the Mountain Hawks' 2021 team captains in December, featuring a pair of second-year captains (graduate student Andrew Eichelberger and senior Teddy Leggett) and a first-time captain (senior Matt Douglas). Eichelberger and Leggett were both captains during the shortened 2020 season.

A U.S. Lacrosse National Hall of Fame inductee, Kevin Cassese enters his 14th season as Lehigh's head men's lacrosse coach in 2021. In Cassese's time, he has led the Mountain Hawks to back-to-back Patriot League Championships – in 2012 and 2013 – followed by a third straight appearance in the league title game in 2014 and return trips to the championship game in 2018 and 2019. Lehigh is the only men's lacrosse program in the Patriot League to reach each of the last nine Patriot League Tournaments as excitement continues to build.

Entering 2021, the Mountain Hawks are ranked in most national polls for a third straight season. Lehigh was off to a 5-1 start in 2020 (2-0 in Patriot League play) when the season was cut short due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Mountain Hawks' offense was averaging 14.0 goals per game (15th nationally) while their defense was allowing just 9.67 per contest (14th). Lehigh was second in groundballs per game (42.33) and eighth in faceoff win percentage (63.8). The Mountain Hawks were ranked 19th in the final Maverick Media Poll. Sophomore Tommy Schelling enjoyed a breakout season with 22 goals and 11 assists in just six games, joining Andrew Pettit and Conor Gaffney on the Tewaaraton Award Watch List. Defenseman Anthony Tangredi was named an honorable mention Media All-American after finishing the shortened season second nationally in caused turnovers per contest (2.67). Gaffney was named a CoSIDA Academic All-American for a third straight year (being named to the second team).

In the summer of 2020, Lehigh continued to make a name for itself in professional lacrosse, with alum Craig Chick and assistant coach John Crawley both playing for Atlas LC of the Premiere Lacrosse League. Pettit and Eddie Bouhall played in Major League Lacrosse, for the New York Lizards and Philadelphia Barrage, respectively.

Cassese helped the Mountain Hawks to a 9-8 record in 2019 despite several injuries to important players. Lehigh's leading returning scorer, Pettit, suffered a season-ending injury during the preseason, with eventual All-League performers Lucas Spence and Christian McHugh missing multiple games in February. The Mountain Hawks continued to battle and it paid off in March, going a perfect 6-0 which helped them earn the No. 2 seed in the Patriot League Tournament. Lehigh earned three consecutive victories over ranked opponents in that span, topping No. 16 Colgate (10-8), No. 17 Army West Point (11-8) and No. 15 Rutgers (13-10) in the span of 11 days. Also that month, Cassese won his 100th career game with a 15-8 victory at Navy. The Mountain Hawks went on to pick up a hard-fought Patriot League semifinal victory for a second straight season, topping Boston University 10-9. Lehigh then led Army 6-4 late in the third quarter in the title game, but the Black Knights came back to win.

As a team, the Mountain Hawks' defense finished sixth nationally in scoring defense (9.47), the fourth time in eight years finishing top 10 in the country. Individually, Gaffney was named Patriot League Faceoff Specialist of the Year, Scholar-Athlete of the Year (for a second straight season) and an Academic All-American. Gaffney broke a number of program and league records, including faceoff wins (249) and groundballs (152). His 69.7 faceoff percentage was good for fourth nationally. Gaffney was one of six Mountain Hawks named All-Patriot League for a second straight season, which included fellow first team honoree, defenseman Craig Chick. Chick continued to re-write the record books, literally, breaking the school record for caused turnovers for a third consecutive season with 42. Most notably, he ended his career with an NCAA career record 160 caused turnovers, becoming the all-time leader in the championship game vs. Army. After the season, Chick was named a second team All-American by both the USILA and Inside Lacrosse/Media, Lehigh's highest USILA All-American in 93 years, since Hugh Robinson was named to the second team in 1926.

Less than a month after the 2018 season, Cassese was named an inductee in the National Lacrosse Hall of Fame Class following a stellar playing career at Duke, in Major League Lacrosse and for Team USA.

The 2018 season saw Lehigh jump back into the national spotlight, beginning with road wins at No. 12 Army West Point and No. 18/19 Hofstra in the span of 10 days. Earning the No. 4 seed in the league tournament, Lehigh dominated Colgate at home (11-6) then picked up a 10-9 overtime win against No. 11/13 Navy. Spence scored the game-winner less than one minute into overtime as Spence (58 points: 35 goals, 23 assists) and Pettit (66 points: 46 goals, 20 assists) combined for 124 points in 2018. Pettit, Chick and Gaffney were named first team All-Patriot League while Spence, defenseman Bouhall and long-stick midfielder Teddy Leggett earned second-team laurels. Leggett also won the Lehigh Athletics' J. Daniel Nolan Award presented to the department's top first-year male student-athlete.

As a team, the Mountain Hawks led the nation in extra-man offense for the second time in seven years as Lehigh's 63.4 percentage was good for second in NCAA history. At one point, Lehigh converted eight straight man-up opportunities and 16-of-19. The 2018 campaign marked the second time in seven seasons the Mountain Hawks led the nation in man-up offense. The other time was 2012, which featured the program's breakthrough as Lehigh finished 14-3 and won its first-ever Patriot League Tournament Championship to advance to the program's first NCAA Tournament. The 2012 campaign featured a school-record 14 wins, nine-game winning streak and the program's highest-ever national ranking; Lehigh came in at No. 4 nationally in the final Coaches Poll following the regular season.

Following a home-opening loss to Villanova in 2012, Lehigh promptly won nine straight games and 13-of-14 to advance to the NCAA Tournament as the No. 7 overall seed. The Mountain Hawks hosted eventual National Finalist Maryland and gave the Terps their toughest fight on their road to the title game. Despite falling behind 6-1 in the first half, Lehigh responded with seven straight goals in front of a standing room only crowd of 2,278 at the Ulrich Sports Complex.

Lehigh posted an impressive 8-3 record against nationally-ranked foes, including a big 9-8 win at No. 4 North Carolina in March, propelling the Mountain Hawks into the national polls for the first time since 2000. Lehigh ended a number of long droughts, defeating UNC for the first time since 1951, Yale for the first time since 1918 and Penn State for the first time since 1971. A big part of the success came from the Mountain Hawks' defense, which stood as the No. 2 scoring defense (only behind Notre Dame), holding opponents to only 6.81 goals per game. Lehigh picked up its first shutout in 40 years with a 13-0 triumph over Manhattan, allowed only two goals to VMI and

five or fewer to Penn State, Navy, Holy Cross, Penn and Saint Joseph's. Cassese was named Patriot League Coach of the Year while freshman Matt Poillon became Lehigh's first-ever Goalkeeper of the Year. Eight cracked the All-Patriot League Team, tied for most in school history.

In 2013, Lehigh won seven straight games, bridging the end of the regular season and Patriot League Tournament, to finish 12-5 overall, undefeated in Patriot League play and earn the right to host the league tournament. Lehigh went on to dominate Bucknell on its home turf (11-5) for its second straight league championship. The awards continued to roll in for the Mountain Hawks as Poillon was named Patriot League Goalie of the Year for a second straight season and a school-record four players were named USILA All-Americans, breaking the record of three set a season prior. In addition, the Mountain Hawks placed a league-best three players on the Academic All-Patriot League Team.

The success continued into 2014 as the Mountain Hawks won 13 games, just one shy of tying the school record set just two years prior. Lehigh earned a thrilling 7-6 triple overtime victory over No. 20 Villanova in February and earned convincing league wins over Bucknell (9-3), Navy (13-2), Holy Cross (20-4) and Lafayette (17-6). The Mountain Hawks defeated Navy in the Patriot League Quarterfinals at home before earning a 12-11 semifinal victory over Army behind a Reid Weber goal with just three seconds remaining.

Several Mountain Hawks enjoyed breakout seasons, led by attackman Dan Taylor who recorded 45 points over his last seven games to finish with 76 points, which far and away led the Patriot League and was most among Canadian players in all of Division I Lacrosse. Taylor was named a first team All-Patriot League honoree, as was defenseman Tripp Telesco. Three others were named All-League while Poillon, Taylor and Telesco were named honorable mention All-Americans as well.

After struggling to begin 2015, the Mountain Hawks ended the season on a high note, winning five of their last six regular season games, defeating a pair of nationally-ranked opponents in a five-day span (No. 14 Princeton and No. 18 Stony Brook). Taylor enjoyed another sensational season, posting 77 points to earn Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year honors and honorable mention All-America recognition. Meanwhile, a young team in 2016 went on to advance to the program's sixth straight Patriot League Tournament, finishing 4-4 in league play highlighted by a thrilling 8-7 win at No. 20 Boston University. Lehigh's 2017 season was highlighted by two consecutive home wins over nationally-ranked foes, defeating No. 16/18 Boston University (10-6) and No. 13/14 Princeton (15-10) while earning a 9-6 home victory over rival Bucknell on Senior Night to earn the program's seventh straight Patriot League Tournament berth.

Setting the stage for the program's breakthrough of 2012, the Mountain Hawks jumped squarely into the national lacrosse picture in 2011 by not only qualifying for the Patriot League postseason, but also proving they could compete with anyone in the country. Lehigh advanced to its first Patriot League Tournament since 2006. The Mountain Hawks got off to a quick 3-1 start, which included a 14-10 triumph over Navy, the program's first victory over the Midshipmen in nearly 100 years. Lehigh posted the nation's eighth biggest improvement in 2011, according to LaxPower.com's computer rankings, which takes into account many of the factors used by the NCAA Tournament selection committee.

In his first four years at Lehigh, Cassese mentored a total of nine All-Patriot League honorees, including four in 2011. Faceoff specialist Ryan Snyder cracked the first team after winning 61.6 percent of his draws and scooping a then-Patriot League record 118 groundballs. Jonathan Stumpf was not only named to the second team, but also became Lehigh's first-ever CoSIDA Academic All-American while being named a Senior CLASS Award first team All-American, USILA Scholar All-American and Patriot League Scholar-Athlete of the Year. Stumpf (along with teammate and current Lehigh assistant coach Will Scudder) also played in the USILA North-South All-Star Game where he netted the eventual game-winning goal for the South.

Under Cassese's watch, Lehigh has sent several players to professional lacrosse. Nine have been selected in the Major League Lacrosse Collegiate Draft since 2013 while multiple others have been picked in the player pool. Roman Lao-Gosney (Florida) played in more than 50 career games since while twin brother Cameron, Mike Noone and Noah Molnar were all veterans of the league. Molnar won an MLL Championship in 2016 and Noone in 2017. In addition, Taylor was the first selection of defending National Lacrosse League Champion Saskatchewan Rush in the 2015 NLL Collegiate Draft. He was picked 12th overall and went on to win NLL Championships with Saskatchewan in 2016 and Calgary in 2019.

Cassese's players have been involved in US Lacrosse as well as defenseman Ty Souders tried out for the U.S. Under-19 Team as part of a three-day training camp at UMBC. Cameron and Roman Lao-Gosney also participated in numerous scrimmages for Team USA, beginning with the Capital Lacrosse Classic on Oct. 7, 2012. In the summer and fall of 2019, Cole Kirst impressed at U.S. Under-19 Team tryout process as well.

On a personal level, Cassese made his coaching debut for US Lacrosse at the 2014 World Lacrosse Championships in Denver, serving as an assistant coach under Team USA head coach Richie Meade (Furman), alongside assistants Dave Pietramala (Johns Hopkins) and Jeff Tambroni (Penn State). Cassese's responsibilities included faceoff coordinator and goalie coordinator while handling rides, clears and the sub game.

As a player, Cassese had an impressive career representing the USA. He was named to the 2010 United States Men's National Lacrosse Team, traveling to Manchester, England. He was named co-captain of that gold medal winning team, alongside Ryan Powell (Syracuse). That marked the third time Cassese earned a spot on the National Team. Cassese also helped the United States to the gold medal at the 2002 International Lacrosse Federation World Championships, while still an undergraduate at Duke University. He was also a member of the United States team that placed second at the 2006 ILF World Championships in London, Ontario.

Cassese is one of the most decorated student-athletes in Duke history. He was a two-time captain and three-time All-ACC selection. Cassese helped lead the Blue Devils to three NCAA Tournament appearances and a pair of ACC Championships during his collegiate career. Cassese earned All-America honors on three separate occasions, including first-team accolades in 2002 and 2003. Cassese, who scored 80 goals and handed out 38 assists in his career, was a two-time Tewaaraton Trophy finalist and garnered ACC Player of the Year honors in 2001. In 2002, Cassese was the recipient of the Lt. Donald MacLaughlin, Jr. Award as the nation's top midfielder. He was also a standout in the classroom, graduating with a 3.59 GPA while earning his Bachelor's Degree in Sociology from Duke. He was selected as a USILA Scholar All-American, ACC Academic Honor Roll member, and was named the ACC's Weaver-James-Corrigan Honorary Award recipient for outstanding athletic and academic achievement.

After his time at Duke, Cassese continued his playing career in Major League Lacrosse for seven years. He was the second overall selection in the 2003 MLL Draft by the Rochester Rattlers. Among his professional accomplishments is earning a spot in both the 2006 and 2010 MLL All-Star Games, winning MVP of the 2016 game. Cassese was traded to the Philadelphia Barrage during the summer of 2007 (which coincided with his hiring at Lehigh) and helped lead his new team to the MLL title that year, as well as a spot in Championship Weekend in 2008.

Cassese's coaching career before Lehigh included a stint as an assistant coach at his alma mater from 2005-07, helping lead the Blue Devils to the 2007 National Championship Game. He also served as Duke's interim head coach for part of the summer of 2006. Prior to Duke, Cassese spent one season at Stony Brook as an assistant where he directed the nation's top extra man offense and helped the Seawolves to a 10-6 record in the spring of 2005.

A native of Port Jefferson Station, New York and graduate of Comsewogue High School, Cassese and his wife, Katie Granson Cassese who attended nearby Freedom High School, were married in Bethlehem in December of 2006. They had their first child, Drew, in July of 2011, their second child, Anna, in August of 2013 and third child, Claire, in July of 2016.
