SETTING THE SCENE

After a thrilling 16-15 overtime win over Holy Cross in the Patriot League Quarterfinals, the Lehigh women's lacrosse team returns to action less than 72 hours later when the third-seeded Mountain Hawks square off against second-seeded and No. 10 nationally-ranked Navy in the semifinals Friday night. Opening draw is set for 7 p.m. on the Patriot League Network. Friday will mark a rematch of last year's semifinals, which the Midshipmen won, 9-8. A nip-and-tuck game saw neither team lead by more than two goals as Navy scored two goals in the final five minutes for the victory.

Last season, the Mountain Hawks finished 12-6, including 6-3 in Patriot League play. This year, Lehigh has done one better (currently owning a 13-5 mark and 7-2 record in league play), despite losing All-Patriot League honorees Allison LaBeau and Lauren Beausoleil to graduation, along with starting goalkeeper Taylor Tvedt (who made 16 saves in last season's semifinal contest). The Mountain Hawks have also lost three starters to season-ending injuries - freshman **Hannah Cermack**, graduate student **Julianne D'Orazio** and junior **Courtney Henig** - but have continued to win. Lehigh's seven league victories this season mark a school record while the 13 overall victories are tied for second most in school history. A win on Friday would equal the Mountain Hawks' school record for wins (14 in 2010). Lehigh brings a seven-game winning streak into Friday's game, its longest streak since 2016.

Out of Lehigh's five losses this season, four have come against nationally-ranked opponents - No. 12 Penn State, No. 14 Princeton, No. 10 Loyola and No. 13 Navy - while the other came on the road vs. one of the NEC favorites in Wagner, who currently stand 11-5 on the season. On Tuesday, the Mountain Hawks won their third straight Patriot League Quarterfinal game. Lehigh is now 38-16 over the last three seasons, by far the most wins over a three-year stretch in school history. The Mountain Hawks' five straight Patriot League Tournament appearances have tied a school record (also 2007-11). Overall, Lehigh has advanced to 10 of the last 12 league tournaments.

Tuesday's win over Holy Cross marked the 100th at Lehigh for head coach **Jill Redfern**. Earlier this season at Columbia, Redfern picked up her 100th collegiate win (which includes her one season at Lafayette), coming in equally exciting fashion. While her 100th Lehigh win came in overtime, her 100th win as a college head coach came after sophomore **Sondra Dickey** scored the game-winning goal at Columbia with just 12 seconds left in regulation.

Tuesday's game was full of runs. Holy Cross went up 3-0 before Lehigh responded with a 5-0 run. The Crusaders began the second half by scoring four of the first five goals to pull even at 8-8, but the Mountain Hawks responded with five in a row. However, the Crusaders came back with four straight and seven of the last nine of regulation to force overtime. That's where junior **Kellie Gough** was the hero, finishing a feed from junior **Olivia Kelly** for her fourth goal of the game, sending the Mountain Hawks back to the Patriot League Semifinals for a third straight season. Lehigh is now 3-2 over its last five Patriot League Tournament games after winning just one of its first 10 (spanning 2003 through 2015).

Gough was one of four Mountain Hawks to record a hat trick Tuesday, along with Dickey (four goals), senior **Haley Wentzel** (three goals, one assist) and junior **Mary Ellen Carron** (three goals, one assist). It was the Mountain Hawks' most goals in a game since the season opener vs. St. Bonaventure. Dickey added two assists for a career-high tying six points while Carron's four points tied a career high. Freshman **Julianne Puckette** added a goal and two assists for her sixth straight game with multiple points. Sophomore **Autumn Ryan** had a goal and assist. Defensively, both Olivia Kelly and senior **Alexis King** tied career highs with four caused turnovers apiece. Dickey tied a career-high seven draw controls while freshman **Samantha Sagi** made nine saves in goal, including a key stop in overtime.

Despite losing 22-of-33 draws in regulation, Lehigh came up with both draws in overtime, which proved critical. Tuesday marked Lehigh's second overtime win of the season and fourth one-goal victory of the year. The two overtime wins are Lehigh's most since the 2003 season and four one-goal victories are most since 2006. The Mountain Hawks have won three consecutive overtime games spanning the last two seasons.

LAST TIME OUT

BETHLEHEM, Pa. (5/1/18) - Holy Cross scored seven of the final nine goals of regulation to force overtime, but Kellie Gough made sure the Lehigh women's lacrosse season wouldn't end on Tuesday as the junior fired home her fourth goal of the game with 13 seconds left in overtime to give the Mountain Hawks a thrilling 16-15 win. With the Patriot League Quarterfinal win, Lehigh has now won three consecutive quarterfinal contests. Winners of seven straight on the season, the Mountain Hawks improve to 13-5, tied for the second most wins in program history and just one from tying the school's all-time record. Tuesday's victory also gives Jill Redfern 100 wins as Lehigh head coach.

IF LEHIGH BEATS NAVY

- Lehigh would win advance to the Patriot League Championship Game for the first time since 2010 and face the winner of No. 1 Loyola and No. 5 Boston University on Sunday at 12 p.m. on CBS Sports Network.
- The Mountain Hawks would improve to 5-11 all-time in the Patriot League Tournament and improve to 4-2 in the tournament over the last two seasons after beginning 1-9 (spanning 2003 to 2015).
- Lehigh would snap a nine-game losing streak to Navy and beat the Midshipmen for the first time since Apr. 23, 2011, a 15-13 win in Annapolis.
- Lehigh would improve to 26-11 over the last two seasons, which would tie for the most wins in school history over a two-year stretch.
- The Mountain Hawks would improve to 39-16 since the beginning of 2016, extending their already school-record for wins over a three-year stretch.

SCOUTING NAVY

Currently No. 10 in the IWLCA National Poll, Navy stands 14-3 on the season, 8-1 in Patriot League play. The Mids' lone losses have come against top 10 opponents Boston College (20-14), Florida (19-16) and Loyola (16-12), who ironically, were all ranked No. 6 at the time of the game. Navy has won five straight since its loss to the Greyhounds, most recently defeating Boston University last Saturday, 23-6. The Mids are led offensively by three players with 70+ points - Kelly Larkin (95 points: 53 goals, 42 assists), Jenna Collins (92 points: 70 goals, 22 assists) and Julia Collins (70 points: 48 goals, 22 assists). Jenna leads the team with 86 draw controls while sister Julia has 69. Jenna's 42 groundballs also lead the team while Marie Valenti leads the defense with 27 caused turnovers. Ingrid Boyum has seen the majority of time in goal, tallying a 10.56 goals against average and 0.402 save percentage.

ALL-TIME SERIES WITH NAVY

The Midshipmen have won nine consecutive games against Lehigh to take a 11-4 lead in the all-time series. The Mountain Hawks won four of the first six meetings between the two sides, with the first meeting coming in 2008 - a 15-12 Lehigh win. Lehigh's most recent victory in the series came on Apr. 23, 2011 at Navy by a 15-13 final. Friday will mark the fifth all-time meeting in the Patriot League Tournament with the Mids owning a perfect 4-0 record. Along with last season's semifinals, Navy won in the semifinals in 2009 and 2011 semifinals, along with the 2010 Patriot League Championship Game.

ALL-TIME IN THE PL TOURNAMENT

Lehigh is 4-11 all-time in the Patriot League Tournament, which includes quarterfinal wins in each of the last three seasons - vs. Colgate in 2016 (13-6), Bucknell in 2017 (15-5) and Holy Cross this season (16-15, overtime).

- In the first half, a pair of Mountain Hawks broke Lehigh's previous single-season record for draw controls. Senior Kayleen Kelly won the game's first draw to give her 48 on the season, breaking the old record of 47 held by Carli Sukonik in 2012. With just over three minutes left in the first half, Dickey picked up her third draw of the game, also giving her 48 draw controls on the season.

PATRIOT LEAGUE SUCCESS

After consecutive 6-3 Patriot League records to tie a school record for league victories (6), Lehigh did one better this season, setting a new mark with seven wins and a 7-2 record. They are 19-8 in league play over the past three seasons, by far the most Patriot League wins over a three-year span in school history. The 0.704 winning percentage over three years is fourth in school history.

Lehigh finished as the No. 3 seed in the tournament for a second straight year, marking its highest seed since being the No. 2 seed in the 2011 tournament.

RECORD SEASONS

SAGI NAMED DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF WEEK (APR. 23)

For the second time in three weeks, freshman goalkeeper **Samantha Sagi** was named Patriot League Defensive Player of the Week on Monday, Apr. 23. Sagi continued her stellar play, stopping 24-of-35 (68.6 percent) of the shots sent her way over two games as Lehigh clinched a Patriot League Tournament berth with a 12-6 win over Lafayette Wednesday before clinching a home game in the Patriot League Quarterfinals with a 14-5 win vs. Bucknell Sunday. Sagi, who also won Patriot League Rookie of the Week in February, began last week with 14 saves, allowing just six goals vs. Lafayette. She stopped 11-of-13 shots sent her way in the second half as Sagi totally shut the door on any Lafayette hopes of a comeback. The Leopards held a 21-16 edge in second-half shots, but Lehigh outscored Lafayette 4-3 in the second due in large part to Sagi's efforts. In the end, the Lehigh defense held Lafayette to its second-lowest goal total of the season as the Leopards scored single-digit goals for just the fourth time in its first 14 games. The Elkridge, Md. native continued to impress vs. Bucknell, tallying 10 stops while allowing just five goals. She stopped 4-of-7 in the first half and 6-of-8 in the second. Sagi added six groundballs and a caused turnover over the two games last week.

DICKEY NAMED PL MIDFIELDER OF WEEK FOR FOURTH TIME (APR. 16)

After filling up the stat sheet once again, sophomore **Sondra Dickey** was named Patriot League Midfielder of the Week on Monday, Apr. 16. Dickey posted career highs in both draw controls (7) and caused turnovers (4) in Saturday's win at Holy Cross while also adding four goals, two assists and four groundballs. All four of Dickey's goals and five of her six points on Saturday came in the second half as she helped turn Lehigh's 7-6 halftime lead into a convincing 15-11 victory. Saturday marked her 12th multi-goal game of the season (in 14 contests), 10th hat trick and sixth game with five or more points.

SAGI NAMED D PLAYER OF WEEK AFTER COLGATE GAME (APR. 9)

After stopping 12-of-18 shots sent her way against Colgate, freshman **Samantha Sagi** was named Patriot League Defensive Player of the Week on Monday, Apr. 9. Sagi finished with 12 saves Saturday, marking her fifth game this season with double-figure saves and third allowing six goals or fewer. Sagi made six saves in each half, stopping six-of-seven shots in the first and six-of-11 in the second. The Raiders had won three straight and five of their previous six games entering the day, but it was the Mountain Hawks who handed Colgate its largest defeat of the season and largest in 16 games dating back to last Apr. 8. Sagi backboned a Lehigh defense which held Colgate to a season-low six goals. The Raiders were averaging 11.82 goals per game and hadn't scored fewer than nine goals all season until Saturday. Sagi helped hold Colgate to its fewest goals scored in exactly 13 months when the Raiders scored six at No. 11 Cornell last Mar. 7.

DICKEY & KING EARN AWARDS AFTER PL OPENER (MAR. 19)

Following a dominant win at Boston University, sophomore Sondra Dickey and senior Alexis King earned Patriot League weekly awards on Monday, Mar. 19. Dickey finished Saturday's league opener with a career-high seven points (three goals, four assists) while King recorded team highs in groundballs (5) and caused turnovers (2) to help the Lehigh defense allow just one first-half goal, on the way to the 15-8 victory. In the end the seven-goal margin (15-8 final) marked Boston University's largest-ever Patriot League regular-season defeat.

Dickey's four assists marked a career high while she scored three goals, good for her seventh hat trick in nine games this season and eighth multi-goal game of the year. Dickey made an impact at both ends of the field, tying for a team-high five draw controls while adding a groundball. She finished with one goal and three assists in the first half and two goals and an assist in the second. Meanwhile, King helped lead a stellar Lehigh defensive effort Saturday as the Mountain Hawks allowed just one first-half goal to Boston University, the Terriers' fewest goals in a half since Mar. 8, 2017 at USC (Southern Cal). In the end, the Mountain Hawks allowed just eight goals, Boston University's fewest vs. a Patriot League team since the 2016 league semifinals against Navy (10-7 loss). It was the Terriers' fewest in a Patriot League regular season game since the 2016 regular season at Navy (12-6 defeat).

D'ORAZIO & DICKEY EARN PL WEEKLY AWARDS (FEB. 26)

Following a thrilling 13-12 last-second win at Columbia, graduate student Julianne D'Orazio was named Patriot League Defensive Player of the Week while sophomore Sondra Dickey earned Midfielder of the Week recognition. The Paoli, Pa. native filled up the stat sheet against the Lions, as did D'Orazio. Dickey scored the game-winning goal with 12 seconds remaining while D'Orazio posted four caused turnovers to eclipse 100 in her career.

The award marked the fourth of D'Orazio's career, also winning Defensive Player of the Week once in 2016 and Midfielder of the Week twice in 2017. A two-way player, D'Orazio played every rep on defense Saturday, helping spearhead a defensive effort which allowed just seven goals over the game's final 51:33. D'Orazio posted a game-high four caused turnovers while also adding five groundballs, five draw controls and four goals. Her goals gave Lehigh a 1-0 lead, pulled Lehigh within 6-5, evened the score at seven and gave Lehigh a 10-9 advantage. D'Orazio reached both the 100 caused turnover and 100 draw control plateaus on Saturday. She is Lehigh's all-time career leader in caused turnovers, and on Saturday, also moved into fourth place in Patriot League history in that category. Meanwhile, Dickey continued her strong play as well, tying career highs in goals (4) and points (5) while adding four groundballs, a caused turnover and five draw controls, tied for the team lead. Dickey's fourth goal was the game-winning goal with 12 seconds remaining, breaking a 12-12 tie and giving the Mountain Hawks a thrilling 13-12 victory, Lehigh's second straight one-goal thriller over Columbia. All four of Dickey's goals were in the second half to help the Mountain Hawks come back from a 7-5 halftime deficit. As a two-way midfielder, Dickey was part of a defense that allowed just seven goals over the game's final 51:33.

HENIG & SAGI EARN WEEKLY AWARDS (FEB. 19)

After nearly leading Lehigh to a victory over No. 12 Penn State, a pair of Mountain Hawks were recognized with Patriot League weekly awards. Junior Courtney Henig was named Attacker of the Week while freshman Samantha Sagi garnered Rookie of the Week. The two helped anchor the Mountain Hawks at the offensive and defensive ends of the field in the slim 14-13 defeat which came down to the wire.

Henig tied a career high seven points on the afternoon (three goals, four assists), becoming the first player to post seven or more points vs. PSU in the regular season since Miranda Stinson of Colorado had nine (five goals, four assists) last Mar. 12 (12 regular-season games ago). Only two players tallied seven or more points vs. Penn State all of last season (the other was Maryland's Jen Giles, who had eight points - four goals, four assists - in the NCAA Semifinals). Henig scored consecutive first-half goals to turn a 4-3 deficit into a 5-4 lead. She later had a hand in Lehigh's first two second-half goals (one goal, one assist) to keep the Mountain Hawks within striking distance, giving them a chance down the stretch. Meanwhile, Sagi helped anchor the defensive efforts, making 16 saves in goal - nine in the first half

and seven in the second - while posting three groundballs and a caused turnover. Sagi held the Nittany Lions to just four second-half goals, Penn State's fewest in a half since scoring three in the second half at Drexel last Mar. 29 (11 games ago). PSU scored four or fewer goals in just six halves last season (out of 42) - just 14 percent of the time.

DICKEY EARNS FIRST OF FOUR WEEKLY AWARDS (FEB. 12)

Following a tremendous season-opening performance vs. St. Bonaventure, sophomore Sondra Dickey has been named Patriot League Midfielder of the Week. The two-way midfielder filled up the stat sheet at both ends of the field, recording three goals, two assists, career-high five groundballs, career-high tying three caused turnovers and career-high six draw controls (which was also a game high on Saturday).

Dickey shattered her previous career high for draw controls of two. Five points tied a career high and three goals marked her third-career hat trick. Dickey assisted on Lehigh's first goal of the season, scored by junior Mary Ellen Carron, and scored her goals at 9:25 of the first half (to give Lehigh an 8-1 lead), at 24:02 of the second half (to give Lehigh a 12-4 lead) and with three seconds remaining in the second half (to give Lehigh an 18-5 lead). Lehigh's 18-5 season-opening win over St. Bonaventure marked the Mountain Hawks' largest margin of victory since Mar. 24, 2015, a 17-4 win at Bucknell. It marked Lehigh's largest margin of victory in a season opener since a 20-6 win at American in the 1994 opener and most goals in an opener since that same year. Dickey was part of a Mountain Hawks' defense that tallied 18 caused turnovers as St. Bonaventure had 33 caused turnovers on the afternoon, most turnovers against the Mountain Hawks in Jill Redfern's tenure as Lehigh head coach (currently in her 10th season). It marked the first time Lehigh has helped force over 30 turnovers since Lafayette had 32 on Apr. 10, 2007. Lehigh's defense held St. Bonaventure scoreless for two long stretches on Saturday - 21:21 in the first half (to turn a 1-0 deficit into an 8-1 lead) and the game's final 19:56 (to turn a 12-5 lead into the 18-5 final).

FOUR NAMED ALL-PATRIOT LEAGUE

BETHLEHEM, Pa. – After recording a program-record seven Patriot League wins this season, four members of the Lehigh women's lacrosse team have earned All-League recognition, as announced on Monday. Senior **Kierstyn Voiro** and sophomore **Sondra Dickey** garnered first-team laurels while senior **Kayleen Kelly** and junior **Courtney Henig** were named to the second team.

This marks the third straight season Lehigh has had four All-Patriot League honorees. Voiro was named to the first team for a second consecutive season. A leader of the Mountain Hawks' defense, she is third on the team in caused turnovers (19) while her 32 groundballs are fifth on the squad and 10 draw controls are tied for fourth. Voiro has recorded multiple groundballs in 11-of-17 games this season. The co-captain has three or more caused turnovers on three separate occasions, including three groundballs and four caused turnovers on Senior Day vs. Bucknell. Voiro is part of a defense that's allowed single-digit goals on eight occasions, allowing just 37 goals over the final five games of the season (7.4/game).

Dickey garnered All-League for the first time in her career, as one of four midfielders named to the 2018 first team. The Paoli, Pa. native has been named the league's Midfielder of the Week four times this season, tied for the most in the league, along with Jenna Collins of Navy. One of two Mountain Hawks to break the previous school record for draw controls in a season, Dickey is second on the team in draw controls (70), while she's first in goals (49) and points (71) and second in assists (22). Dickey has recorded multiple goals in 14-of-17 games this season with 12 hat tricks after recording two as a freshman. Among Dickey's highlight games was a career-high eight points and seven draw controls at Holy Cross, to go with four groundballs and four caused turnovers. At Columbia, she scored the game-winning goal with 12 seconds remaining to give the Mountain Hawks a thrilling 13-12 victory.

In the midst of an impressive senior season, Kelly earned her first-career All-Patriot League honor. Kelly has broken three Lehigh draw control records this season – draws in a game (10 vs. Bucknell), season (currently 77) and career (160). The previous school season was 47 by Carli Sukonik in 2012. Kelly also leads the Mountain Hawks in groundballs (45) and is second in caused turnovers (21). She has recorded multiple groundballs in all but two games this season while tallying multiple caused turnovers in 15-of-17 games as well. At Army West Point, Kelly recorded six groundballs, five draw controls and four caused turnovers. She also posted three groundballs, four caused turnovers and a school-record 10 draw controls vs. Bucknell in a Senior Day to remember. Kelly has consistently covered the opponent's top scoring option and has thrived as an anchor of a defense that is fourth in the league, allowing 10.57 goals per contest.

Henig was also named All-League for the first time, earning a spot on the second team despite missing the final five games of the season due to injury. Despite playing just 12 games, she still leads the Mountain Hawks in assists (24) and is second in points (43), averaging 3.6 points and 2.0 assists per game. Henig was named Patriot League Attacker of the Week on Feb. 19 after seven points (three goals, four assists) vs. No. 12 Penn State. She became the first player to post seven or more points vs. the Nittany Lions in the regular season in almost a year (Miranda Stinson of Colorado on Mar. 12, 2017). Henig went on to post multiple points in all but two games, also recording six vs. No. 14 Princeton and at Wagner, and five at Columbia.

KELLY, VOIRO NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-LEAGUE

BETHLEHEM, Pa. – A pair of Lehigh women's lacrosse seniors added to their accolades on Wednesday as **Kayleen Kelly** and **Kierstyn Voiro** were named to the 12-player Academic All-Patriot League team. Both were All-League honorees on the field, while excelling in the classroom as well.

After being named second team All-Patriot League on Monday, her first-career All-League recognition, Kelly was named Academic All-League for a second straight season. The Industrial and Systems Engineering major owns a stellar grade point average of 3.88, which includes three perfect 4.0 terms. The Ellicott City, Md. native has been named to the Dean's List in every semester of her academic career, garnering Patriot League Academic Honor Roll laurels as well.

On the field, Kelly has broken three Lehigh draw control records this season – draws in a game (10 vs. Bucknell), season (currently 82) and career (currently 165). The previous school record for a season was Carli Sukonik, who recorded 47 in 2012. Kelly leads the Mountain Hawks in draw controls (82) and groundballs (47) while she stands second with 22 caused turnovers. Kelly has recorded multiple groundballs in all but two games this season while tallying multiple caused turnovers in 15-of-18 games. Among Kelly's standout performances came at Army West Point when she recorded six groundballs, five groundballs and four caused turnovers while adding three groundballs, four caused turnovers and a school-record 10 draw controls vs. Bucknell in a Senior Day to remember.

After being named first team All-Patriot League for a second straight year, Voiro earned her first-career Academic All-League recognition. Named the Mountain Hawks' Scholar-Athlete of the Year following last season, the Moorestown, N.J. native owns a 3.51 cumulative GPA in Finance. She has earned a spot on the Dean's List on multiple occasions and has been named to the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll every year as well.

On the field, Voiro is a leader of the Mountain Hawks' defense. She's tied for third on the team in caused turnovers (19) while she's tied for fourth in both groundballs (34) and draw controls (10). The co-captain has recorded three or more caused turnovers on three separate occasions, including three groundballs and four caused turnovers vs. Bucknell. Kelly and Voiro are a part of a defense that has allowed single-digit goals on eight occasions and currently stands fourth in the league in goals against average (10.75). The Mountain Hawks allowed just 37 goals over the final five games of the regular season (7.4/game) to help lead them to six straight wins heading into the Patriot League Tournament. With Tuesday's Patriot League Quarterfinal victory over Holy Cross, the Mountain Hawks have now won seven straight to improve to 13-5 overall, tied for the second most wins in school history and just one from tying the record.

JILL REDFERN
 Head Coach
 10th Year as Lehigh Head Coach

A National Lacrosse Hall of Famer, Jill Redfern enters her 10th year as head coach of the Lehigh women's lacrosse program in 2018. In her tenure, Redfern has led the Mountain Hawks to seven Patriot League Tournaments in nine seasons, including in each of her first three years, which extended Lehigh's overall streak to five in a row. The Mountain Hawks have also made the league tourney in each of the last four seasons (2014, 2015, 2016 and 2017). In her time, the Mountain Hawks own a 87-66 record, including seasons of 11, 14, 10, 13 and 12 victories, as Redfern continues to take the Lehigh program to new heights.

Redfern was inducted into the National Lacrosse Hall of Fame in September. During her playing days, Redfern was a two time Division III All-American at Ursinus College and was named Most Outstanding Player of the 1986 NCAA Tournament as she helped lead the Bears to a national championship. Following her collegiate playing experience, Redfern was a member of the US National Lacrosse Team from 1987-1993, and capped off her international play as a member of the winning United States World Cup Team in 1993, in Edinburgh Scotland.

As a coach, Redfern has led Lehigh to sustained success. The Mountain Hawks posted a 25-11 combined record from 2016-17, tied for the 22nd most wins in the nation over that two-year stretch. Most recently, the Mountain Hawks went 12-6 in 2017, including a 6-3 mark in Patriot League play to earn the No. 3 seed in the league tournament where they defeated Bucknell 15-5 in the quarterfinals. It marked the first time in school history Lehigh won a Patriot League tournament game in back-to-back seasons. Allison LaBeau highlighted the victory, setting a Patriot League Tournament single-game record with 11 points, which included a record-tying six assists. LaBeau finished the year with a school-record 46 assists along with 91 points - second in school history. The Mountain Hawks went on to play a hard-fought game against Navy in the league semifinals, dropping a slim one-goal final against a Mids' team that went on to beat Penn, UMass and North Carolina in the NCAA Tournament to advance the Final Four.

Lehigh finished the 2016 season with a strong 13-5 record, including a 6-3 record in the Patriot League. The six league victories marked a school record while the Mountain Hawks hosted a league tournament game, and won a postseason contest, for the first time since 2010. Lehigh beat Colgate in the Patriot League quarterfinals to reach the semifinals for the first time since 2011. LaBeau was named the league's Attacker of the Year while Julianne D'Orazio and Kendall Garden were also named first team All-League, and Lauren Beausoleil garnered second team laurels. The Mountain Hawks earned a big road victory at Boston University while taking Loyola into overtime during the regular season, then playing a competitive back-and-forth game against the Greyhounds in the Patriot League Semifinals.

The Mountain Hawks advanced to their second straight Patriot League Tournament in 2015, finishing the season 9-8 highlighted by several quality victories. Included was a thrilling, last-second win at Bryant, a team that went on to win the NEC and advance to the NCAA Tournament. The Mountain Hawks also topped Big Ten foe Rutgers on the road in front of a nationally-televised audience on the Big Ten Network. Lehigh won its last two regular season games to earn the No. 5 seed in the league tournament.

Individually, Lauren Willcox was named first team All-Patriot League for a second straight season, earning All-League honors for a third consecutive year. Garden was also named to the first team while Kelly Scott and LaBeau garnered second team laurels. In addition, both Willcox and Carli Sukonik earned Academic All-Patriot League for a second straight season. As a team, the Mountain Hawks finished 2015 with the league's third-best goals against average (8.06) while leading the Patriot League in caused turnovers per game (9.71). Sukonik's 42 goals were fifth in the league while LaBeau's 48 points stood eighth. Garden led the league with 31 caused turnovers.

Lehigh enjoyed a resurgent season in 2014, finishing 4-4 in league play to advance to the Patriot League Tournament for the first time since 2011. Included was a dramatic 12-11 double overtime win at Boston University to hand the eventual league finalist Terriers their first-ever Patriot League defeat. LaBeau scored both goals of overtime as she was named the league's Rookie of the Year. LaBeau was one of five Mountain Hawks to earn All-Patriot League honors as she, Alexandra Fitzpatrick and Willcox were all named to the first team while Garden and Sukonik earned second team laurels. After the season, LaBeau was invited to try out for the U.S. National Team.

Sukonik's All-League honor was her third in as many years as she has posted 98 goals and 14 assists in that span, finishing her storied career with 140 goals and 18 assists. Three Mountain Hawks were named All-Patriot League honorees in

both 2012 and 2013: Sukonik (twice), Julie McBrien (twice), Leigh Ann Torcivia and Willcox. Fitzpatrick was named first team All-League as both a freshman (2011) and senior (2014) as one of the nation's elite goalies both seasons. As a graduate student, Fitzpatrick went on to lead the Maryland Terrapins to the National Championship as their starting goalkeeper in 2015.

Torcivia and McBrien played in the IWLCA North-South Game in 2012 and 2013, respectively, following Lauren Dykstra, who was named the Game's MVP in 2011. In the summer of 2013, Dykstra became the first Lehigh alum to play in the World Cup as she suited up for Israel. Dykstra finished the tournament with 20 goals (second on the team). She helped propel Israel to the World Cup Quarterfinals in the country's first appearance.

In 2011, the Mountain Hawks advanced to their fifth straight Patriot League Tournament, joining Colgate as the only teams to qualify in each of the previous five seasons. Lehigh also posted an impressive win at Navy in front of a national television audience on CBS Sports Network, joining eventual National Champion Northwestern as the only two teams to defeat the Midshipmen in Annapolis. The Mountain Hawks hung tough on the road against nationally-ranked ALC squads Florida and Penn State, taking an early second-half lead against the Gators, a team which rose as high as No. 2 in the national rankings. Lehigh finished among the national leaders in a number of statistical categories, ranking ninth in scoring margin (4.65), 11th in scoring defense (8.94), 12th in draw controls (13.94) and 13th in scoring offense (13.59).

Redfern helped lead Dykstra, who garnered three postseason All-America honors, which included becoming Lehigh's first IWLCA All-American since 1996. The multi-dimensional Dykstra finished 2011 as the nation's leader in goals per game, winning Patriot League Midfield Player of the Year to complete the cycle of league major awards; Dykstra previously won Rookie of the Year, Offensive Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year. Redfern also coached Dykstra to a Lehigh and Patriot League record in career goals as Dykstra stands sixth in NCAA history with 257.

During her inaugural season as Lehigh head coach, Redfern led the Mountain Hawks to the fourth most victories in a single season in school annals, the most home wins in program history and the program's third consecutive Patriot League Tournament berth as Lehigh tied the school mark for the most Patriot League victories in a single season (four). That would be one-upped as Lehigh went 5-1 in league play both in 2010 and '11. Redfern's success continued in 2010 as the Mountain Hawks jumped out to an 8-0 start before winning the Patriot League Regular Season Title and advancing all the way to the Championship Game.

Redfern was named the head women's lacrosse coach at Lehigh on June 23, 2008. Prior to that, she served as the associate head coach of the program. During that time, she helped lead the Mountain Hawks to a pair of Patriot League Tournament appearances and helped mentor 13 All-Patriot League selections, three consecutive Rookie of the Year honorees and a pair of Patriot League Scholar-Athlete of the Year award winners.

In 2008, Redfern brought on assistant coach Kelley Putnam. The two went on to mentor a program record eight All-Patriot League selections, including freshman Kelly Draper who earned the program's fourth consecutive Patriot League Rookie of the Year Award - a first for all programs among all sports in Patriot League history. Redfern was also instrumental in the development of Dykstra who was named Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year, First Team All-Region and was selected to the final tryout for the United States Women's Developmental Team.

Redfern has enjoyed a very successful career in coaching, which includes a previous stint at Lafayette College where she garnered Patriot League Coach of the Year honors in 2000 after leading the Leopards to the league title. Redfern also served as an assistant in both the field hockey and lacrosse programs at Lafayette for 10 years before assuming the head coaching position. Including her time at Lafayette, Redfern's career record as head coach is 98-69.

Redfern is a 1988 graduate of Ursinus College, and later earned her master's degree in Educational Leadership from Lehigh in 1991. She was inducted into the Ursinus Hall of Fame in 1998 for her exceptional contributions to women's athletics.

Redfern and husband Tom reside in New Jersey with their two children, Nicholas (20) and Cecily (18) and their dog Licorice.
